1	A RESOLUTION endorsing the Seattle-King County
2	department of public health's 2009 tuberculosis control
3	program, as outlined in the response to the 2009 King
4	County Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 16312, Section 92,
5	Proviso P3.

7	WHEREAS, although tuberculosis is preventable and curable, it remains a serious
8	public health threat in King County, and
9	WHEREAS, in 2007, active tuberculosis cases in King County reached a thirty-
10	eight-year high, with one hundred sixty-one cases reported, an eleven percent increase
11	over 2006, and
12	WHEREAS, the rate of tuberculosis in King County in 2007 was 8.6 cases per
13	hundred thousand individuals, higher than the Washington State and national rate of 4.4
14	cases per hundred thousand individuals, and
15	WHEREAS, tuberculosis disproportionately affects poor, foreign-born and
16	homeless populations in King County, and

17	WHEREAS, the tuberculosis control program in King County serves over three
18	times as many people of color, four times as many individuals living under two hundred
19	percent of the federal poverty level, three times as many uninsured, and over ten times as
20	many people who have limited English speaking skills, as compared to the overall King
21	County population, and
22	WHEREAS, individuals who do not adhere to treatment are more likely to
23	develop drug-resistant tuberculosis, require prolonged treatment, experience disease
24	progression or relapse, and are more likely to die as a result of their infection, and
25	WHEREAS, drug-resistant tuberculosis can cost two hundred fifty thousand
26	dollars per person to treat, and
27	WHEREAS, the Seattle-King County department of public health has a statutory
28	responsibility for treating and controlling tuberculosis in King County, and
29	WHEREAS, the Seattle-King County department of public health's tuberculosis
30	control program seeks to maximize adherence to treatment and minimize development of
31	drug-resistant tuberculosis, and
32	WHEREAS, reflecting the financial crisis in public health and in King County's
33	general fund, the 2009 proposed King County budget for public health included over four
34	hundred thousand dollars in reductions for tuberculosis control activities, and
35	WHEREAS, in the 2009 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 16312, the King County
36	council restored two hundred fifty thousand dollars of the reduction in tuberculosis
37	control and by proviso required the department of public health to submit a report on
38	tuberculosis control activities, and

39	WHEREAS, the Seattle-King County department of public health has submitted a
40	proviso response on tuberculosis control activities and a plan for how funds shall be used
41	to manage the highest priority cases of tuberculosis of public health significance;
42	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF
43	KING COUNTY:
