- 2. EAB Purpose and Schedule: Board reviews purpose and schedule for upcoming meetings
 - a. Purpose: To advise King County as they create a targeted hire plan. Addressing targeted hire plan, apprenticeship goals, small contractors and suppliers.
 - b. Schedule:

3. Initial Plan Review:

- a. Daniel Villao presents the initial plan outline draft.
- b. The Advisory Board is asked to review and provide feedback at this meeting and in the time before the next meeting on Nov 19th.

4. Board Activity/Feedback:

- a. Even though this plan is specific to the CFJC project, it should somehow include language that the components should be clear to contractors in the bidding process.
- b. Possibly a list of intended contractors to be provided as early as possible in process.
- c. Can the plan include language of breaking up and diversifying the work?

- d. Flow-down goals: To what tier of contractor should they apply, rules around how small a contractor would need to be to be exempt?
 - i. King County needs to clarify if a flow-down provision is in the design-builders contract.
- e. The County should continue direct outreach to community groups and community forums around this project, even though it is contentious and difficult.
- f. The process should go smoothly, and not over-complicate or make things overly difficult for the stakeholders involved.
- g. The County should use its existing relationships with elected officials in the targeted areas to coordinate outreach and engagement activities, to help and support their communities utilizing this process.

5. Wrap-up/Next Steps:

- a. The next Board meeting is on November 19th
- b. Stakeholders will be invited to the next meeting to provide feedback on plan draft.
- c. Feedback on the plan and questions on the data will be compiled in the next couple of weeks.
