Total Judicial Cases Only ("Matters Filed with Clerk" excluded)





Chart 1-B. Quarterly Filings: Criminal, Domestic, General Civil and Juvenile Offender Cases Only

Total Judicial Cases Only ("Matters Filed with Clerk" excluded)





Chart 2-B. Quarterly Resolutions: Criminal, Dmestic, General Civil and Juvenile Offender Cases Only

Total Judicial Cases Only ("Matters Filed with Clerk" excluded)




Chart 4-B. Active Pending Caseload at Quarter End: Domestic and General Civil Cases Only





Chart 4-C. Active Pending Caseload at Quarter End:

# Appendix Glossary and Definition

## General Definition

### **Active Status**

A case is active if it is not on suspense status (see Suspense Status).

### **Case**

A case is defined as a filing with an assigned case number (or a case number plus a defendant connection code in pre-1990 criminal filings).

### **Completion**

A case is completed when dispositive document is filed with the court following resolution.

### **Jury Trial**

A hearing is reported as a jury trial if the jury is impaneled.

### **New Case**

A new case is an original filing with new case number assigned.

### **Non-Jury Trial**

A hearing is reported as a non-jury trial if an opening statement is made, waived, or reserved. A juvenile fact finding hearings is reported as a non-jury trial.

### **Pending Case**

A case is defined as pending if it is unresolved and active (not in suspense).

### **Reactivated Case**

A case returns to active status from suspense status during the reporting period.

### **Re-opened Cases**

A case is re-opened if it has been previously completed but returns to the court for supplement or change of the original case resolution. A re-opened case does not have a new case number. Only resolved cases can be "re-opened". (Note: measurement not available as of July 1996. SCOMIS capacity may exist after conversion to DB2 in the future).

### **Resolution**

A case is resolved if all issues in the complaint are fully adjudicated.

### **Suspended Case**

A case is placed in suspense status from active status during the reporting period.

### **Suspense Status**

A case is on suspense status if it is on warrant, appeal, stay, mediation, arbitration ("Deferred Prosecution" is not a suspense status, but is treated as a resolution).

### **Trial**

A hearing set before a judge or jury in which all the issues in the case are meant to be resolved. A trial normally includes opening statements to the court or jury stating what the evidence will show, introduction of witnesses and exhibits for direct and cross examination, final arguments to the court or jury in which counsel argue both the evidence and the law, and judgment by the court or jury stating what the facts of the case are and what law applies to the facts. In a jury case, it also includes the selection of the jury. A trial can be held

for one or more cases. A single trial may be held to adjudicate more than one case (as defined above).

### **Post-resolution Modifications**

In this report, we also report the post-resolution modifications for case type 3 (domestic) and 5 (paternity). These numbers are based on the tracks (DMOD and DTBA) opened after the original resolution date (i.e., if the track beginning date is after the resolution date).

### **Additional Filings with Clerk**

Filings with clerk without assigning a SCOMIS case number. This reporting category consists of search warrants, wire taps, extradition, oaths and orders pertaining to Pro Tem judge/commissioners/Court

### **Civil RALJ Cases**

### **Comparison with Court Standard**

### **Court Standard**

Benchmarks set by a state advisory committee and adopted by the court indicating percentage of cases to be resolved at certain age (in months, 1 month = 30 days as used in the Advisory Case Processing Time Standard as published in the Court Rule).

Court standard is based on timelines as suggested by State Advisory Committee. For a case type with no time standard, the standard for a similar case type is adopted if appropriate.

*Criminal: 90% by 4 months, 98% by 6 months, 100% by 9 months.*

*Civil: 90% by 12 months, 98% by 18 months, 100% by 24 months.*

*Domestic: 90% by 8 months, 98% by 10 months, 100% by 14 months.*

*Adoption/Paternity: 90% by 8 months, 98% by 10 months, 100% by 14 months.*

***Percentile***

Percent of cases resolved at a given age. For example, if resolved cases had a 98 percentile of 12 months, it means that 98% of the cases were resolved within the age of 12 months, or conversely 2% of the cases were resolved after 12 months, not counting suspense time.

**Section III. Pending Caseload**

**Adjustment**

Adjustment made because of vacating of resolutions, or change in suspense status between two reporting period.

**End Pending**

Total number of pending cases at the end of reporting period.

**Previous Pending**

Total number of pending cases at the beginning of reporting period.

**Resolution Rate**

Resolution rate is defined as the ratio of number of resolutions to number of new filings (i.e., number of resolutions divided by number of new filings) during the reporting period. The resolution rate measures the relative pace of resolution in relation to the pace of new filings. A resolution rate of greater than 1 indicates the number of resolutions exceeds the number of new filings.

**On-review Status**

Cases that have been resolved (post-resolution) but still need court resources for periodic review and other remaining outstanding issues.

*Probate (EST), Paternity (PAT) and Dependency (DEP): Resolved and not completed (paternity or dependency established, but outstanding issues remain).*

*Guardianship (GDN,LGD,G/E): Resolved and on tracks of G1,G2,G3,GE or GD; Minor Settlement (MST): Resolved with a future hearing date.*

**Section IV. Age of Pending Cases**

**Case Age**

The age of a case is the time (number of days) since the filing date, less any suspense time if applicable.

**Median Age**

The median age is the time that 50% of the cases are under and 50% are above the given age. For example, if pending cases have a median age of 12 months, it means that 50% of the pending cases are within the age of 12 months, and 50% of pending cases are over 12 months. The median age is more robust to cases with extreme age values than the average age.

**Suspense Time**

Time (days) that a case is on suspense status before its resolution. If a case has more than one suspense between filing and resolution, the suspense time is the total from all suspenses. Time on suspense status after resolution (e.g., appeals) is not counted.
