## **RESOLUTION NO. 2375**

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Lake Washington School District No. 414, King County, Washington, providing for the submission to the qualified electors of the district at a special election to be held therein on November 5, 2024, of a proposition to authorize the district to levy an additional tax of \$37,900,000 in 2025 for collection in 2026, \$69,000,000 in 2026 for collection in 2027, \$75,500,000 in 2027 for collection in 2028, \$138,900,000 in 2028 for collection in 2029, \$172,500,000 in 2029 for collection in 2030, and \$183,100,000 in 2030 for collection in 2031 for the District's Capital Projects Fund for rebuilding, enlarging, and equipping two elementary schools and two middle schools and upgrading existing facilities to meet the current and future educational programs for its students.

WHEREAS, the educational facilities of Lake Washington School District No. 414, King County, Washington (the "District"), are in need of renovation, construction, improvements and expansion to meet the current and future educational programs for its students; and

WHEREAS, funds available to the District will be insufficient to enable the District to implement such projects; and

WHEREAS, in order to support the cost of these projects as found necessary by the Board of Directors, it is deemed advisable that the District levy a tax upon all the taxable property within the District in excess of the annual tax the District is permitted by law to levy without a vote of the people, such levy to be made for six years commencing in 2025 for collection in the school years from 2025-2026 through 2030-2031, inclusive, as authorized by Article VII, Section 2 of the State Constitution and RCW 84.52.053; and

WHEREAS, the question of whether or not such excess tax may be levied must be submitted to the qualified electors of the District for their ratification or rejection; and

WHEREAS, the conditions here and above set forth which requires the holding of a special election in the District;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAKE WASHINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 414, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Finding</u>. It is hereby found and declared that the welfare of the students and other residents of the District requires the District to carry out the improvements hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Authorization of Improvements. The District shall expand its school facilities through the construction, renovation, improvement and expansion of new and existing facilities, including, but not limited to rebuild and enlarge (including equipping) Alcott and Smith Elementary Schools; Rebuild and enlarge (including equipping) Kamiakin and Evergreen Middle Schools; upgrade the fieldhouse and pool facilities at Juanita High School, other capital projects or modifications to provide capacity for educational programs, and shall make other capital project expenditures as found necessary by the Board of Directors.

The District may repay any obligations hereafter incurred for the foregoing purposes.

If available funds are sufficient upon completion of the above improvements, the District may undertake additional construction, modernization, and remodeling and make other capital improvements to the facilities of the District, all as approved by the Board of Directors; provided that such funds may be used only to support the construction, modernization, replacement, and remodeling of school facilities or implementation of the District's technology facilities plan.

If the District shall determine that it has become impracticable to accomplish any of such improvements or portions thereof by reason of changed conditions or needs, incompatible development, costs substantially in excess of those estimated, or acquisition by a superior governmental authority, the District shall not be required to accomplish such improvement and may apply levy proceeds as set forth in this section. If any or all of the improvements have been

completed, or their completion duly provided for, or their completion found to be impractical, the District may apply the levy proceeds or any portion thereof to other portions of the improvements or to other capital purposes of the District, as the District in its discretion shall determine. Notwithstanding any provision of this resolution to the contrary, levy proceeds may only be used to support the construction, modernization and remodeling of school facilities.

Section 3. Authorization of Levies. It is hereby found and declared that best interests of the District require the submission to the qualified electors of the District of the proposition whether the District shall make the Capital Projects Fund levies for their ratification or rejection at a special election to be held on November 5, 2024. For the purpose of providing funds necessary for the needs described in Section 2 above, King County Elections, as *ex officio* supervisor of elections in King County, is hereby requested to call and conduct such special election to be held within the District on such day and to submit to the qualified electors of the District for their approval or rejection, a proposition providing for tax levies for the Capital Projects Fund for six years, commencing in 2025, producing dollar amounts at estimated tax rates per thousand dollars of assessed value to produce such amounts, in excess of the maximum amount tax levy permitted by law to be levied within the District without a vote of the electors, all as follows:

- A. \$37,900,000, said levy to be made in 2025 for collection in 2026;
- B. \$69,000,000, said levy to be made in 2026 for collection in 2027;
- C. \$75,500,000, said levy to be made in 2027 for collection in 2028;
- D. \$138,900,000, said levy to be made in 2028 for collection in 2029;
- E. \$172,500,000, said levy to be made in 2029 for collection in 2030; and
- F. \$183,100,000, said levy to be made in 2030 for collection in 2031.

The estimated levy rate depends upon the final dollar amount of assessed value of the property within the District. At this time, based upon information provided by the County Assessor's office, the estimated levy rate for the 2025 levy is \$0.35 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, the estimated levy rate for the 2026 levy is \$0.61 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, the estimated levy rate for the 2027 levy is \$0.63 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, the estimated levy rate for the 2028 levy is \$1.10 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, the estimated levy rate for the 2029 levy is \$1.31 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, and the estimated levy rate for the 2030 levy is \$1.32 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation. The exact levy rate shall be adjusted based upon the actual assessed value of the property within the District at the time of the levy.

<u>Section 4</u>. <u>Approval of Form of Ballot</u>. The Secretary of the Board of Directors is hereby authorized and directed to certify said proposition to King County Elections, as *ex officio* supervisor of elections in King County, substantially in the following form:

#### **CONSTRUCTION LEVY**

The Board of Directors of Lake Washington School District adopted Resolution No. 2375 for an educational facilities capital levy. This proposition authorizes rebuilding/enlarging Alcott and Smith Elementary Schools, Kamiakin and Evergreen Middle Schools, and upgrades to the fieldhouse/community pool at Juanita High School; and authorizes the following excess levies for such purposes on all taxable property within the District:

The Associate Superintendent, Business and Support Services is authorized to approve changes to the ballot title, if any, deemed necessary by King County Election or the King County Prosecuting Attorney.

Section 6. Voters' Pamphlet. Pursuant to RCW 29A.32.220, the Board of Directors hereby confirms the District's participation in the local voters' pamphlet for the November 5, 2024 election, which shall be prepared and published by King County Elections, including, but not limited to, an explanatory statement reviewed and approved by the District's attorney, and, if available, a Statement For and a Statement Against. The District understands and agrees that it will be required to pay its proportionate share of the expenses of the voters' pamphlet.
