ANNEXATION INTO THE RENTON REGIONAL FIRE AUTHORITY

A resolution of the Board of Commissioners of King County Fire Protection District No. 40 (District) approving annexation into the Renton Regional Fire Authority (RRFA) and approving of the RRFA's proposed plan amendment

WHEREAS, RCW 52.26.300 permits annexation of a fire protection district into the boundaries of a regional fire authority, following enactment of necessary resolutions; and

WHEREAS, the District Board of Fire Commissioners (Board) passed Resolution No. 587 calling for annexation into the RRFA, on August 8, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the RRFA passed resolution No. 2024-05 concerning a proposed RRFA plan amendment including annexation of the District, on November 12, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the District has determined that annexation into the RRFA is in the best interest of the citizens of the District, to improve service delivery and regionalization objectives; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the necessary annexation election should take place on April 23, 2025.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of King County Fire Protection District No. 40 as follows:

Section 1. The District approves of the RRFA plan amendment, attached hereto and incorporated by reference, in all respects, including but not limited to an amendment of the RRFA governance structure establishing a 3-2-2 governance structure with weighted voting, with three RRFA board members being appointed members of the Renton City Council, two RRFA board members being appointed commissioners of King County Fire District 25, and two RRFA board members being appointed commissioners of King County Fire District 40.

Section 2. The District approves of the annexation of the District into the RRFA as set forth in the RRFA plan amendment, and approves of said annexation being subject to the terms of the RRFA plan amendment.

Section 3. The Board hereby requests the Auditor of King County, Washington, as ex officio County Supervisor of Elections, to call and conduct such special election to be held within the District on April 23, 2025, and to submit to the qualified electors of the District the proposition in substantially the following form:

The Board of Fire Commissioners for King County Fire Protection District No. 40 adopted Resolution No. 592, concerning a proposition to approve the plan amendment of the Renton Regional Fire Authority (RRFA) to include annexation of the District into the RRFA, subject to the terms of the plan amendment attached to Resolution No. 592. Shall District voters approve of the RRFA plan amendment and annexation of the District into the RRFA, making the District a part of the RRFA?

Section 4. The locations of the polling places, if any, shall be as specified by the Auditor of King County, Washington, as ex officio County Supervisor of Elections for the District.

Section 5. Approval of the proposition described in Section 3 above, by a simple majority, shall be construed and interpreted as qualified elector approval of annexation in compliance with RCW 52.26.300.

Section 6. With respect to this election, the District shall participate in the publication of information in the Local Voters’ Pamphlet, including but not limited to an explanatory statement reviewed and approved by the District’s attorney, a Statement For, and a Statement Against, pursuant to Chapter 29.81A of the Revised Code of Washington. The District Secretary is hereby delegated the authority to finalize the aforementioned explanatory statement and appointment of For and Against committees.

Section 7. For purposes of receiving notice of any matters related to the ballot title, as provided in RCW 29A.36.080, the Board hereby designates the District Secretary as the individual to whom the County Auditor shall provide such notice.

Section 8. The District Secretary is authorized to implement such administrative procedures as may be necessary to carry out the directives of this resolution, including the appointment of For and Against Committees, the preparation of Explanatory Statements with approval by legal counsel, and modifying the text of the ballot title and any other text, language and/or descriptions relative thereto necessary to conform such ballot title, text, language and/or descriptions to the intent of the parties, consistent with the objectives of this resolution.

Section 9. The District Secretary is hereby directed to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the Auditor of King County, Washington, as ex officio County Supervisor of Elections for the District, on or before February 22, 2025, pursuant to RCW 29A.04.321.

Section 10. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.



APPROVING RENTON REGIONAL FIRE AUTHORITY PLAN AMENDMENT FOR ANNEXATION OF
KING COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 40

WHEREAS, On August 8, 2024, King County Fire Protection District No. 40 approved Resolution 587 expressing its intent to annex the District into Renton Regional Fire Authority and filed such Resolution with the Renton Regional Fire Authority Governing Board; and

WHEREAS, Renton Regional Fire Authority staff worked with King County Fire Protection District No. 40 staff to establish the terms and conditions of annexation as set forth in the 2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan with a proposed effective date of July 1, 2025, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, The 2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan, if approved by King County Fire Protection District No. 40 and if approved by a simple majority of the voters of King County Fire Protection District No. 40 shall replace the existing Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan in its entirety effective July 1, 2025; and


WHEREAS, If the 2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan is not approved by King County Fire Protection District No. 40 and the voters of King County Fire Protection District No. 40 prior to July 1, 2025, the proposed 2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan shall be null and void;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Renton Regional Fire Authority Governing Board hereby approves the attached 2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan attached hereto as Exhibit A, and directs the Fire Chief to submit this Resolution together with the 2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan to King County Fire Protection District No. 40.

HISTORY

Recognizing the challenges and opportunities that all fire jurisdictions are facing, the City of Renton and King County Fire Protection District No. 25, through a partnership of many years, agreed to explore the different governance and funding options available to provide fire protection and emergency medical services to the communities we serve.

In 2016, the voters of the City of Renton and King County Fire Protection District No. 25 voted to approve the 2016 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan, which formed the Renton Regional Fire Authority.

The Renton Regional Fire Authority has provided services to King County Fire Protection District No. 40 pursuant to an interlocal agreement since the formation of the Renton Regional Fire Authority, and King County Fire Protection District No. 40 has filled a non-voting advisory position on the Governance Board.

Copies of the original 2016 RFA Plan are retained in the Renton Regional Fire Authority Administrative Offices.

On November 12, 2024, the Renton Regional Fire Authority Governing Board approved an amendment of the 2016 RFA Plan ("2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan") to submit to the voters of the King County Fire Protection District No. 40 as part of the process of annexing King County Fire Protection District No. 40, as a participating jurisdiction, into the Renton Regional Fire Authority. On April 22, 2025, the voters of King County Fire Protection District No. 40 approved the amended RFA Plan and King County Fire Protection District No. 40 was formally annexed into the Renton Regional Fire Authority on July 1, 2025.

SECTION 1: BACKGROUND & NEEDS STATEMENTS

A. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS:

1. The ability to respond to emergency situations by fire protection and emergency services jurisdictions has not kept up or progressed with the community's needs and special service demands. Anticipated increase in population will likely exacerbate this problem.
2. Providing a fire protection and emergency services system requires a collaborative partnership and responsibility among local and regional governments, the private sector, and the community.
3. Delivery of core emergency services and timely development of significant projects can best be achieved through stable funding options for regional fire protection and emergency services.
4. The Renton Regional Fire Authority shall provide the highest level of fire and emergency services to our community within the confines of available resources to the Participating Jurisdictions.

A. DEFINITIONS

1. The definitions in this section apply throughout this **RFA Plan**, unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
 - 1.1. **"Board", "Governance Board" or "Governing Board"** means the Governance body of a regional fire protection service authority.
 - 1.2. **"City"** means the City of Renton.
 - 1.3. **"District 25"** means King County Fire Protection District No. 25.
 - 1.4. **"District 40"** means King County Fire Protection District No. 40
 - 1.5. **"RFA Plan Effective Date"** means July 1, 2016.
 - 1.6. **"2025 RFA Plan Effective Date"** means July 1, 2025.
 - 1.7. **"Fire Benefit Charge"** is a service charge determined by the required fire-flow and personnel and equipment costs associated with fighting a fire in a particular type and size of structure. The initial calculation method and formula is described in Appendix B of this plan.
 - 1.8. **"Interlocal Agreement"** means the interlocal service agreement between the RFA and the City of Renton in provisioning of certain administrative and support services per the adopted Plan.
 - 1.9. **"Participating Jurisdictions"** means the City of Renton, King County Fire Protection District No. 25 and King County Fire Protection District No. 40.
 - 1.10. **"RCW"** means Revised Code of Washington.
 - 1.11. **"Regional Fire Protection Service Authority" or "Regional Fire Authority" or "RFA"** means a regional fire protection service authority formed pursuant to chapter 52.26 RCW. An RFA is a municipal corporation, an independent taxing authority within the meaning of Article VII, Section 1 of the state Constitution, and a taxing district within the meaning of Article VII, Section 2 of the state Constitution.
 - 1.12. **"Regional Fire Authority Plan," "RFA Plan" or "Plan"** means this Regional Fire Protection Service Authority Plan, drafted and approved in accordance with chapter 52.26 RCW for the development, financing and operation of the Renton Regional Fire Authority.

1.13. **"2025 Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan" or "2025 RFA Plan"** means the RFA Plan as amended by the Renton Regional Fire Authority Governing Board and approved by the King County Fire Protection District No. 40 voters.

1.14. **"Renton Regional Fire Authority" or "RRFA"** means the Regional Fire Protection Service Authority defined in this plan whose boundaries are coextensive with the City of Renton, King County Fire Protection District No. 25 and King County Fire Protection District No. 40.

RFA SECTION 2 PLAN REVISION DISPOSITION:

The **DEFINITIONS** section of the **RFA Plan** is subject to amendment or revision only by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.

SECTION 3: FORMATION AUTHORITY

Revision	The FORMATION AUTHORITY section of the RFA Plan is subject to amendment or revision only by submission of a revised RFA Plan to the electorate for approval.
Adopted	July 1, 2016
Revised	July 1, 2025

A. REGIONAL FIRE PROTECTION SERVICE AUTHORITY.

1. Chapter 52.26 RCW provides statutory authority for the formation of a Regional Fire Authority by the City of Renton, King County Fire Protection District No. 25 and King County Fire Protection District No. 40.
2. The Renton Regional Fire Authority was created pursuant to law when the voters of the City of Renton and King County Fire Protection District No. 25 approved the RFA Plan at an election on April 26, 2016, as authorized by Chapter 52.26 RCW.
3. The authority to annex additional Participating Jurisdictions into the RFA requires approval of an RFA Plan amendment by both the RFA Governing Board and the voters of the annexing Participating Jurisdiction pursuant to RCW 52.26.300.

B. 2025 RFA PLAN APPROVAL AUTHORITY.

1. The legislative bodies of the Renton Regional Fire Authority and King County Fire Protection District No. 40 reviewed and approved the 2025 RFA plan Amendment and King County Fire Protection District No. 40 called for an election to vote on the 2025 Plan Amendment by the voters of the District.
2. The 2025 RFA Plan must be approved by a simple majority vote of the voters of King County Fire Protection District No. 40 and if so approved the 2025 RFA Plan shall be effective on the 2025 RFA Plan Effective Date.
3. Upon voter approval of the RFA Plan, the City, District 25 and District 40 shall continue to exist as Washington State Municipal Corporations. The exclusive purpose of the continued existence of Districts 25 and 40 shall be to levy and collect taxes and/or other fire protection district revenue to be transferred to the RFA until such time as the RFA collects its own revenues and to provide representation to the newly formed RFA Governance Board.

If the 2025 RFA Plan is not approved by a simple majority of the District 40 voters, then operations relating to the services set forth herein shall remain under the 2016 RFA Plan and the 2022 Interlocal Agreement between the Renton Regional Fire authority and King County Fire Protection District No. 40.

RFA SECTION 3 PLAN REVISION DISPOSITION:

The **FORMATION AUTHORITY** section of the **RFA Plan** is subject to amendment or revision only by submission of a revised RFA Plan to the electorate for approval.

SECTION 4: JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES

<i>Revision</i>	The JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES section of the RFA Plan is subject to amendment or revision only by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.
<i>Adopted</i>	July 1, 2016
<i>Revised</i>	July 1, 2025

A. JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES ON DATE OF FORMATION.

1. On the **2025 RFA Plan** Effective Date, the jurisdictional boundaries of the RFA shall be the legal boundaries of the Participating Jurisdictions. The boundaries are depicted on the map attached hereto and marked as **Appendix A** of this RFA Plan.

B. CHANGES IN JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES AFTER FORMATION OF THE RFA.

1. Boundary Changes that do not require an RFA Plan amendment.
 - 1.1. **City annexations of areas included within the boundaries of the Districts.** Such annexations will not affect the RFA since the areas will already be within the RFA boundaries. Pursuant to RCW 52.26.290 there will be no required asset or employee transfers between the fire protection districts and the city.
 - 1.2. **City annexations of areas not included within the Districts.** On the effective date of such annexation, the territory annexed shall automatically be included within the boundaries of the RFA pursuant to RCW 52.26.290. The territory added to the RFA by such annexation shall be subject to the taxation, charges, and bonded indebtedness (if approved as part of the annexation process) of the RFA. Any transfer of assets or employees that occurs as a result of annexation shall be between the transferring entity and the RFA.
 - 1.3. **Annexation of a portion of the District by a City that is not a Participating Jurisdiction in the RFA.** On the effective date of such annexation, the territory annexed shall automatically be removed from the boundaries of the RFA. In this situation the RFA shall not be obligated to transfer employees or assets of the RFA and the annexing city shall be restricted solely to assets and employees of the District, if any.
 - 1.4. **RFA Annexations.** Pursuant to RCW 52.26.090(g), the RFA shall have the authority to conduct annexations of unincorporated territory adjacent to the RFA pursuant to the statutory authority and procedures set forth in Chapter 52.04.001 through RCW 52.04.051.
 - 1.5. **RFA Partial Mergers.** Pursuant to RCW 52.26.090(g), the RFA shall have the authority to participate in the partial merger process under the authority and pursuant to the procedures set forth in RCW 52.06.090 and .100.
2. Boundary Changes that require an RFA Plan Amendment.
 - 2.1. **Annexations of Adjacent Fire Protection Jurisdictions.** The boundaries of the RFA may be expanded to include adjacent fire protection jurisdictions through the Plan

Amendment and annexation procedures set forth at RCW 52.26.300.

RFA SECTION 4 PLAN REVISION DISPOSITION:

The **JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES** section of the **RFA Plan** is subject to amendment or revision only by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.

SECTION 5: GOVERNANCE

<i>Revision</i>	The GOVERNANCE section of the RFA Plan is subject to amendment or revision only by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.
<i>Adopted</i>	July 1, 2016
<i>Revised</i>	July 1, 2025

A. GOVERNING BOARD STRUCTURE AND OPERATION.

1. **Governing Board.** As provided by RCW 52.26.080, the RFA Governing Board shall be established consistent with the terms of this Section and shall have authority as of the 2025 RFA Plan Effective Date.
2. **Composition of Governing Board.** Upon the effective date of the RFA, the **Governing Board** shall include seven (7) voting members consisting of:
 - 2.1. Three (3) current seated elected officials from the City to be appointed by the City Council.
 - 2.2. Two (2) current seated members of the Board of Commissioners of District 25 to be appointed by the District 25 Board of Commissioners.
 - 2.3. Two (2) current seated members of the Board of Commissioners of District 40 to be appointed by the District 40 Board of Commissioners.
 - 2.4. Each Participating Jurisdiction may also appoint 1 alternate member that can only act as a voting member when one of the appointed members from that Participating Jurisdiction cannot attend a meeting.
3. **Weighted Voting.** Governing Board decisions shall be based on a total of 24 votes. Simple majority decisions shall require 13 favorable votes, super majority votes, when required by the law shall require 15 favorable votes. The votes shall be allocated among the Board members as follows:
 - 3.1. Each City appointed Board Member vote shall count as 4 votes.
 - 3.2. Each District appointment Board member vote shall count as 3 votes.
 - 3.3. A quorum of the Board shall consist of Board members representing at least 13 votes.
4. **Nonvoting Members.** There shall also be a nonvoting member, representing contracting agencies, if any. The nonvoting member shall be a current seated elected official from a fire district or a city that contracts with the RFA.
5. **Changes to Governing Board.** The composition of the Governing Board can be changed in the future by following the process identified in the RFA bylaws to amend this Section of the Plan.
6. **Governing Rules.** The RFA Governing Board has adopted by-laws, governance policies and rules for the RFA Governing Board to conduct business in accordance with RCW 52.26.080.

7. **Authority.** The RFA Governing Board shall have all the power and authority granted governing boards under Washington State law and shall include the power and authority to make any decisions appropriate for the RFA and for matters related to Title 52 RCW.
8. **Compensation of Governing Board.** Commissioners of the Governing Board will receive compensation in the same manner and under the same conditions as provided by law for commissioners of a fire protection district organized under Title 52 RCW.

RFA SECTION 5 PLAN REVISION DISPOSITION:

The **GOVERNANCE** section of the **Plan** may be amended by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.

SECTION 6: FUNDING AND FINANCE

Revision	The FUNDING and FINANCE section of the RFA Plan is subject to amendment or revision by the Governing Board except when voter approval is required by statute.
Adopted	July 1, 2016
Revised	July 1, 2025

A. RFA REVENUES:

- 1. Tax Levies.** The RFA shall be authorized to levy and collect taxes in accordance with RCW 52.26.050 (1) (b) subject to the maximum statutory tax levy rate of \$1 per thousand of assessed valuation. The initial tax levy rate for the year in which a Participating Jurisdiction annexes into the RFA (if completed prior to October 1 or the subsequent year if completed after October 1) shall be established pursuant to the rule established under WAC 458-19-035.
- 2. Benefit Charge.** The RFA shall continue to impose a benefit charge on all improved properties within the RFA service area in the manner set annually by the RFA Governing Board.
- 3. Service Contracts.** To the extent permitted by law, the RFA Governance Board shall have the authority to pursue and contract with agencies and entities exempt from property taxes in accordance with RCW 52.30.020 and related statutes.
- 4. Fire Impact and Mitigation Fees.** The RFA has entered into an interlocal agreement with the City of Renton to collect impact fees in the City. The RFA shall have authority to pursue impact fees outside the City of Renton in accordance with state law.
- 5. Additional Revenue Options.** The RFA Governing Board shall have the authority to pursue, subject to any applicable statutory voter approval requirements and the RFA Plan Amendment, if required, all additional revenue sources authorized by law including but not limited to revenue sources specifically identified in Title 52 RCW and Title 84 RCW that are not otherwise addressed in chapter 52.26 RCW.

B. TRANSFER OF ASSETS.

- 1. District 40 Assets.** On the 2025 RFA Plan Effective Date, District 40 shall immediately transfer any remaining and future assets to the RFA. Such assets shall include all real property and personal property, including but not limited to furniture, office equipment, motor vehicles, reports, documents, surveys, books, records, files, papers, or written material owned by or in the possession of the District.
- 2. District 40 Taxes, Benefit Charges and Funds.** On the 2025 RFA Plan Effective Date, District 40 shall transfer all Fund balances and all accrued and future tax and benefit charge revenues to the RFA.
- 3. Termination of Interlocal Agreement.** On the 2025 RFA Plan Effective Date, the interlocal agreement between the Renton RFA and District 40 shall terminate.
- 4.** Except as otherwise provided in this RFA Plan, whenever any question arises as to the transfer of any funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other tangible property

used or held in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties and functions transferred, the governing body of the Participating Jurisdiction owning such assets shall make a determination as to the proper allocation.

C. DEBT.

- 1. Future District Expenses.** All future costs incurred by either District on or after the 2025 RFA Plan Effective Date shall be the responsibility of the RFA.

RFA SECTION 6 PLAN REVISION DISPOSITION:

The **FUNDING AND FINANCE** section of the **RFA Plan** is subject to amendment or revision by the Governing Board except when voter approval is required by statute.

SECTION 7: ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE - PERSONNEL - ADMINISTRATION

Revision	The ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE - PERSONNEL – ADMINISTRATION section of the RFA Plan is subject to amendment by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.
Adopted	July 1, 2016
Revised	July 1, 2025

A. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE.

1. **Organizational Chart.** The RFA shall be organized as provided in **Appendix B**.

The **ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE – PERSONNEL - ADMINISTRATION** section of the **RFA Plan** is subject to amendment by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.

SECTION 8: OPERATIONS AND SERVICES

Revision	The OPERATIONS AND SERVICES section of the RFA Plan is subject to amendment by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.
Adopted	July 1, 2016
Revised	July 1, 2025

A. FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

1. The RFA shall provide all fire protection, and emergency medical services and non-emergency medical services within its jurisdictional boundaries at levels set by the Governing Board.

B. FIRE PREVENTION SERVICES.

1. On the RFA Plan Effective Date, Fire Prevention Services within the boundaries of the RFA shall be provided as follows:
 - 1.1. Within the City of Renton: The RFA will provide Fire Prevention Services to the City of Renton. City of Renton shall designate the RFA Chief as its Fire Chief and the RFA Fire Marshal as its Fire Marshal, and the City will provide enforcement and prosecution support when appropriate.
 - 1.2. Within unincorporated King County: King County shall provide Fire Prevention Services.

C. FIRE INVESTIGATION SERVICES.

1. On the RFA Plan Effective Date, Fire Investigation Services within the boundaries of the RFA shall be provided as follows:
 - 1.1. Within the City of Renton: The RFA will provide Fire Investigation Services to the City of Renton and the City of Renton shall designate the RFA Chief as its Fire Chief and the RFA Fire Marshal as its Fire Marshal. The City of Renton shall cooperate with the RFA in such investigations and provide police support and prosecute criminal acts when appropriate.
 - 1.2. Within unincorporated King County: King County shall provide Fire Investigation Services.

D. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICES.

1. On the RFA Plan Effective Date, Emergency Management Services within the boundaries of the RFA shall be provided as follows:
 - 1.1. Within the City of Renton: The City of Renton shall provide Emergency Management Services within the city boundaries.
 - 1.2. Within unincorporated King County: King County shall remain the provider of Emergency Management Services.

E. PUBLIC EDUCATION SERVICES.

1. On the RFA Plan Effective Date of the creation of the RFA, the RFA shall provide Public

Education Services throughout the jurisdiction of the RFA.

RFA SECTION 8 PLAN REVISION DISPOSITION:

The **OPERATIONS AND SERVICES** section of the **RFA Plan** is subject to amendment by a majority vote of the RFA Governance Board.
