Who is eligible?

- Enrolled in Washington State Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA)
- Enrolled in Washington State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR).
- School-to-Work accepts students regardless of level of disability.
- Wants to work in the community
- Last year of transition (Age 21)
 - * Some younger students per Agreements with School Districts.
- **Enrolled in a school district** within King County or a partnering County.
- Student must apply for benefits through the **Social Security** Administration (SSA).
- Able to obtain Medicaid or other long term funding.

What is School-to-Work?

- A Partnership Program Between:

 - Washington State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR)
 - Washington State Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA)
 - * School Districts
 - * Job Support Agencies
 - * Students and Families

What does School-to-Work Do?

- Connects students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) to employment services Early: while they are still in their high school transition programs.
- Assists students with I/DD to obtain paid employment prior to exiting their high school transition programs.
- Provides customized one-on-one support to be successful in obtaining and keeping a job.

When and How to Apply

 - * If your school program has a preselected Job Support agency or if you interview agencies.
