#### **Training Description:**

There are a number of new requirements coming on-line regarding how construction and demolition materials are to be managed and reported. Projects permitted in the City of Seattle must already meet new requirements and King County and King County cities are beginning to adopt similar ordinances. Compliance is not difficult, time consuming, or expensive if you understand what is required and have contracts in place which include the new standards.
