King County recently renewed the Green Building Ordinance 17709. It requires that all county capital projects incorporate cost-effective green building and sustainable development practices. The new Green Building Ordinance (GBO) streamlines policies and reporting requirements with other sustainability policies. The Sustainable Infrastructure Scorecard is one tool the majority of King County projects use to capture sustainability strategies.

Training Description:

This training will provide you with an update on the new GBO policy changes and minimum performance and reporting requirements. You will learn about new procedures and tools created based on feedback from project managers for increased user friendliness and time savings related to reporting. You will also learn how to use the Sustainable Infrastructure Scorecard and about the different sustainable development categories and credits, the documentation process and available resources.

By the end of the session, participants will:

- ◆ Understand the new Green Building Ordinance policies and requirements
- ◆ Know which reporting documents to use and how to use them
- ◆ Know what needs to be reported and when to submit
- ◆ Know the specific elements that must be considered when designing and constructing capital projects
- ◆ See how projects relate to the Sustainable Infrastructure Scorecard

Training Approach:

This training is primarily informative and in presentation format. It includes some audience participation and a session to practice applying the Sustainable Infrastructure Scorecard to a local project. The training is aimed at King County project managers, project team members, and staff responsible for county capital assets.
