Dr. Fleming, Director and Health Officer, Public Health - Seattle and King County, reported on influenza levels in King County. He indicated that rates are increasing and this strain is resulting in higher mortality and occuring in a younger population. It is the H1N1 strain and is included in the flu shot this year. He encouraged people to get a flu shot.

Dr. Fleming also recognized the 50 year anniversary of the Surgeon General's first report regarding the hazards of smoking. It is estimated that 8 million Americans are alive today because of it.
