1. Call to Order

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The meeting was called to order at 1:31 p.m.

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Boardmember Kohl-Welles served in place of Boardmember Lambert. Boardmembers Delecki and Birney were also in attendance.

4. Approval of Minutes of January 19, 2017

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Boardmember Delecki moved to approve the minutes of the January 19, 2017 meeting as presented. Seeing no objection, the Chair so ordered.

6. <u>Director's Report</u>

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Patty Hayes, Director, provided a briefing on the West Point treatment plant emergency bypass that resulted in significant discharge of untreated wastewater and stormwater into Puget Sound. Public Health posted Do Not Contact signs at five beaches. As water samples have been tested and approved, the signs have been removed.

Ms. Hayes announced that Public Health - Seattle and King County's HIV/Aids program is the first, or one of the first, local jurisdictions to reach the World Health Organization (WHO) goal that 90% of people infected with HIV know their status, 90% are in treatment and 90% are virally suppressed. That is three years ahead of the WHO schedule.

Ms. Hayes also shared that a media launch of the secure medicine return program occurred and King County has nearly 100 secure medicine return locations.
