## Signature Report

### Resolution 21-04

**Proposed No. 21-04.2**

**Sponsors**

1                   A RESOLUTION urgently requesting the Washington state  
2                   Legislature to hold a hearing on the management of  
3                   COVID-19 prevention and outbreaks in Washington state  
4                   Department of Corrections facilities and to initiate an  
5                   independent investigation of allegations about  
6                   mismanagement of COVID-19 precautions and the impacts  
7                   on people currently incarcerated.

8                   WHEREAS, on June 18, 2020, the King County Board of Health adopted  
9                   Resolution 20-08 declaring racism a public health crisis and committing to work to  
10                  advance a public health approach in addressing institutional and systemic racism, and

11                  WHEREAS, Resolution 20-08 expressed the Board of Health's commitment  
12                  ongoing work around race and equity and being responsive to communities and residents  
13                  impacted by racism, especially Black and Indigenous and People of Color, and

14                  WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provides guidance  
15                  on management of coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") in correctional and detention  
16                  centers including a recommendation to implement a fourteen-day quarantine period, and

17                  WHEREAS, Black, Indigenous and People of Color are incarcerated at higher  
18                  rates than white communities in King County and across the nation, and

19                  WHEREAS, Black, Indigenous and People of Color experience higher rates of

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20 COVID-19 infection than white communities, and

21 WHEREAS, as of February 17, 2021, throughout Washington state Department of  
22 Corrections ("WSDOC") facilities, there have been 6,117 confirmed COVID-19 cases,  
23 which is 39 percent of the average population of incarcerated people, and 14 COVID-19  
24 deaths of incarcerated people, and

25 WHEREAS, in King County, WSDOC facilities with COVID-19 outbreaks  
26 included 36 cases at Bishop Lewis Work Release accounting for 73 percent of the  
27 residents, and 8 cases at Reynolds Work Release, and

28 WHEREAS, community advocates and families have actively organized to  
29 address the needs of incarcerated individuals in WSDOC facilities and concerns over  
30 mismanaged and delayed COVID-19 outbreak responses, including peaceful  
31 demonstrations, reaching out to WSDOC leadership as well as local and state elected  
32 officials and the King County Board of Health, and

33 WHEREAS, after hearing powerful public testimony during the January 18, 2021,  
34 King County Board of Health meeting, the Board is concerned about reports of multiple  
35 COVID-19 outbreaks in facilities operated by the WSDOC, and

36 WHEREAS, the Board submitted a letter to the WSDOC highlighting those  
37 concerns and urging the WSDOC to take immediate action to implement recommended  
38 public health practices to reduce the risk of infection and illness to all people in those  
39 facilities, and

40 WHEREAS, the Board is alarmed by the increased risk of exposure to COVID-19  
41 to all King County residents due to those outbreaks at WSDOC facilities in our  
42 community and the WSDOC's mishandled responses to them;

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43           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Health of King

44 County:

45           The King County Board of Health urgently requests the Washington state  
46 Legislature to hold a hearing on the WSDOC's management of COVID-19, including  
47 prevention and outbreaks within WSDOC facilities and including vaccination planning,  
48 prevention and response measures. The Board also recommends that the Washington  
49 state Legislature conduct an independent and thorough review of WSDOC's handling of

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- 50 Reynolds and Bishop Lewis COVID-19 outbreaks and ongoing mismanagement of
- 51 COVID-19 and the impacts on people currently incarcerated.


