NEWS: Executive Constantine transmits emergency legislation to fund child care services for first responders

King County Executive Dow Constantine sent legislation to the King County Council on March 30 proposing the release of \$2.2 million in funding from Sound Transit educational taxes to provide emergency child care to first responders and other essential workers who live or work in King County.

What we know about COVID-19 so far...

COVID-19 is a new disease, caused be a novel (or new) coronavirus that has not previously been seen in humans.

What we know about COVID-19 so far...

Someone who is actively sick with (i.e. has symptoms of) COVID-19 can spread the illness to others:

a) through respiratory droplets when someone coughs or sneezes.

b) when someone touches a surface that has the virus on it and then touches their nose, mouth, or eyes.

What we know about COVID-19 so far...

The virus can live on surfaces for up to 3 days (72 hours).

People begin to show symptoms between 2 and 14 days after being exposed.



Symptoms

People at higher risk of developing <u>more severe</u> <u>illness</u> if they become infected with COVID-19 are:

- 60 years and older
- People with weakened immune systems (i.e. due to cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, prolonged use of immune weakening medications)
- People with another high-risk health condition (i.e chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, serious heart conditions, severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] > 40), poorly controlled diabetes)
