BLACK TAR HEROIN MAY BE CONTAMINATED

- A suspected WOUND BOTULISM case has been reported in King County. Health officials believe the case is related to injecting black tar heroin.
- Injecting heroin that contains the bacteria that causes botulism can cause **serious** infection and even death.

SYMPTOMS TO WATCH:



Weakness and drooping eyelids

Blurred or double vision

Extreme dry mouth and sore throat



These **symptoms can start several days to several weeks** after injecting contaminated drugs. You may or may not notice an abscess. If not treated quickly, botulism can cause paralysis, shut down your breathing and cause death. If it is caught early, it can be treated.

If you have any of the symptoms, <u>go the nearest EMERGENCY</u> <u>ROOM</u> immediately. Take this flyer so you will be seen quickly.
