- Evaluate Public Health Services


Key Benefits


Terms and abbreviations

- **Cis** or **Cisgender** = not transgender
- Non-binary = an umbrella term used to describe a person who doesn't identify with binary genders man/woman. Includes many different genders, including: genderqueer, gender nonconforming, gender fluid, non-binary, agender, bigender, and more.
- Trans or Transgender = an umbrella term to describe a person whose gender differs from their sex assigned at birth









Demographics: Race & Ethnicity








HIV Risk: Sex Exchange


In the last 12 months, did you have sex in exchange for money, drugs, or other needs?








HIV Risk: Condom Use








PrEP: Continuum
