

VACCINES PROTECT US FROM COVID-19

WHO can get the vaccine?

- The vaccine is free for everyone.
- Everyone age 12 and older can get the vaccine.
- ADA options and interpretation are available.
- You do not need ID or insurance. You will not be asked to share immigration or citizenship status.



WHY get the vaccine?

Protect your community and yourself from getting sick with COVID-19.



It is your choice to get a vaccine or not.

HOW does it work?

The vaccine teaches your body to defend itself against COVID-19.



The vaccine cannot give you COVID-19.

It does not contain pork or egg.

Some vaccines take two doses, and others take one dose.

Is the vaccine SAFE?



- ✓ YES. Every vaccine is safe and effective for people of different races and ethnicities, body types, health conditions, and ages (you must be 12+ for Pfizer, or 18+ for J&J and Moderna).
- ✓ Every COVID-19 vaccine has had to pass many safety steps by doctors and health experts.

VACCINES PROTECT US FROM COVID-19

What happens when I get the vaccine?

A health worker will ask you a few questions, then give you the vaccine in your upper arm.



Another health worker will wait with you for 15 – 30 minutes to make sure you are safe and answer any questions.

What happens AFTER I get the vaccine?

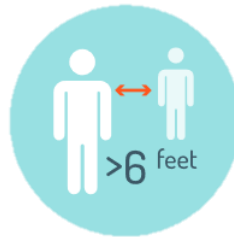


- Some people might have a sore arm, a headache, or feel tired. This is normal and will go away after a day or two.
- Remember to drink lots of water, stay warm, and rest.
- You are fully vaccinated two weeks after your last dose.

To protect others, please continue to:



Wear a mask



Stay six feet from others



Wash hands often
