Rebates

A **rebate of up to \$300** for septic maintenance activities is available in King County PIC focus areas. Find out if you are in a focus area at www.kingcounty.gov/pic.

To be eligible for the rebate:

- Complete the online form at www.kingcounty.gov/oss/pic, or call 206-477-8050.
- Complete a free online septic maintenance workshop.
- Complete septic system maintenance (inspection, riser installation, and/or pumping).

The deadline to complete all items for the rebate is **December 31, 2021** and funding for rebates is limited. The rebates will be given on a first-come, first-serve basis until funding is exhausted.

Repair Grant Program

Grants of up to \$5,000 are available in the PIC focus areas for small septic repairs or to supplement other financial assistance offers. To be eligible for the program, King County property taxes must be current, and the property must not be in the process of foreclosure. Preference will be granted to those that:

- Are enrolled in senior or disabled property tax exemption through the King County Assessor's Office,
- Do not exceed 120% of King County Area Median Income, or
- Other extenuating circumstances may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Eligible project activities:

- Pump repair or replacement, including system controls
- Distribution box repair or replacement
- Tank repair or replacement
- Installation of risers in combination with other repair to correct failure
- Pumping to stop sewage overflow from tank
- Connection to nearby sewer
- OSS replacement
- Other septic system repairs as approved by King County

Grant money will be paid directly to the contractor hired to complete repairs.

Craft3 Clean Water Loan Program

Qualified applicants may use the loans to repair or replace failing septic systems. The loans may cover the full cost of designing, permitting, installing and maintaining your system, or the cost of connecting to a public sewer, when permitted by Public Health.

Owner and non-owner occupied properties are eligible to apply, including commercial, secondary, rental and vacation properties. Businesses, nonprofits, and individuals, including those without access to traditional financing, are eligible to apply. Special rates and deferred payment options may be available for homeowners with lower incomes.
