# What is the King County Mobility Coalition?

The King County Mobility Coalition (KCMC) is a cross-sector group that brings together individuals and organizations to improve mobility for all. The Coalition collaborates to identify gaps, barriers, and new opportunities, strategize on solutions, and prioritize needs for project planning. The KCMC shares goals to facilitate the coordination, efficiency, and availability of transportation services to meet the specific needs of people who are transportation disadvantaged.

# Vision

A coordinated transportation network that allows all people to move freely around King County and the Puget Sound region.

# Purpose

The purpose of the King County Mobility Coalition is to inform the planning of special needs transportation services in King County and develop strategies, tools, and projects to improve mobility for people with limited transportation options due to age, income, disability, limited English proficiency or other limiting factor. The Coalition brings together individuals and organizations to share information; assess the needs of the local community and current transportation network; provide recommendations to improve the system; and educate decision-makers, community groups, and the general public.

# Who does the King County Mobility Coalition serve and how?

The KCMC serves the entire community with the goal of supporting a stronger mobility network for all. In doing so, the KCMC puts special emphasis on those with more limited transportation options due to age, income, disability, limited English proficiency, and other factors.



# Committees

## Access to Healthcare

The Access to Healthcare Committee gets together to discuss the extremely pertinent overlay of mobility and healthcare topics. Committee partners include those representing hospitals, transportation service providers, emergency service providers, healthcare-related service providers, individuals passionate about the coordination of transportation to healthcare, and more.

## Access to Work and School

The Access to Work and School Committee convenes to brainstorm and confront the way transportation and mobility can be barriers or aids to helping people access education and employment. This Committee works closely with institutions like schools and businesses to better understand how mobility can be a service for their unique needs.

# Inclusive Membership

The KCMC strives to have consistently diverse and equitable membership. This involves an intentional membership roster that appoints 30+ members and alternates from cross-sector agencies – between human service representatives, city staff, transportation providers, end-users, and more.

# Coordination

Through meetings, communications, our newsletter, and more, the KCMC disseminates pertinent information on mobility and needs to our cross-sector partners. We work to ensure people are well informed about changes and needs, as well as serve as a connector and liaison to cultivate partnerships between our network.

# Collaboration

Our Coalition approaches programming through a participatory, inclusive process. The majority of our projects include bringing key stakeholders together for a thorough outcome – as we always identify these projects first through Coalition decision-making. Engaging with our Coalition is two-way street, and we also offer our own perspective and capacity to the work of others through various methods.

# Advocacy

The King County Mobility Coalition engages in advocacy by identifying, addressing, and elevating the needs of our communities. The goal of our work is to use a community-based approach that exposes room for growth and improvement, which we will then leverage our coordination and collaboration to solve.



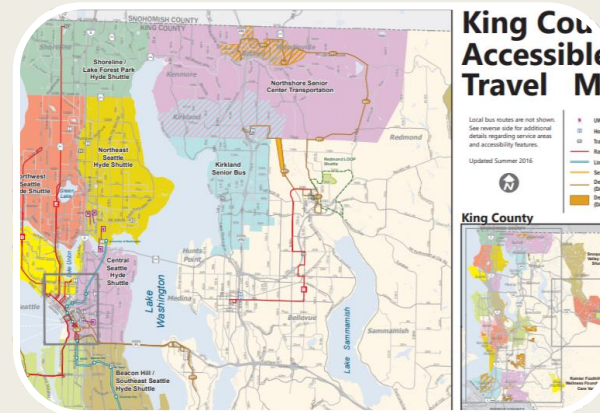
# Examples of Past Work

## Inclusive Planning Summits



In 2018, as part of a Transit Planning 4 All Inclusive Planning grant, the KCMC held two summits, four listening sessions, and distributed a survey to understand how people in our region find and secure transportation.

## Accessible Travel Map



The KCMC regularly updates our Accessible Travel Map, which details the various mobility services beyond mass transit that exist in our county.

## Immigrants and Refugees Needs Assessment



The Coalition worked with University of Washington graduate students to produce a needs assessment evaluating the needs, gaps, and barriers to mobility immigrants and refugees face in King County.
