2022 Legislative Session

The state's legislative session for 2022 is in session until March 10th.

- This is a "short session" in the biennial legislative cycle
- Legislature will consider a supplemental biennial budget for July 2021- June 2023
- Session is largely remote

Legislative Atmosphere

While the Legislature typically considers fewer substantive policy proposals in short sessions, this has been a busy session.

- Ongoing pandemic and economic recovery
- Interest in refining major policy initiatives from past legislative sessions, such as behavioral health and long-term care
- Revenue forecast has increased by roughly \$4B since last session
- Rapidly shifting federal landscape, with pending "Build Back Better" package under discussion in Congress
