Monday, February 8 2021 Zoom Meeting

CALL TO ORDER

- 1. Welcome & Introductions Kristina Sawyckyj welcomed members to the meeting of the HCHN Governance Council (GC). Full quorum present.
- 2. Minutes

GC members reviewed the minutes from the 1/11 meeting. Zsa Zsa Floyd made motion to approve the minutes, Leslie Enzian seconded; vote was unanimous in favor of the motion.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

PROGRAMMATIC ORIENTATION

1. Access & Outreach – Public Health

Callista Kennedy, Program Manager with the <u>Access and Outreach</u> program, shared information on services and impacts of COVID.

2. HCHN Street Medicine Team

Kammi Lopez, Nurse Practitioner, shared information on the Street Medicine Team. PowerPoint is attached.

REGULAR AGENDA AND BOARD PROCESS

1. HCHN Admin Update

a. King County Annual Audit Update

Katherine King noted no audit findings for Public Health as previously presented to GC, but two findings in other parts of King County. She shared more details about the King County findings, and what HCHN continues to do at the program level to ensure compliance. She also mentioned that HCHN will likely be selected for audit later this spring, and will share results of that audit once finalized.

b. Staffing Updates

Denise Hawthorne mentioned that the initial workgroup, which includes members with lived experience, will look at the next batch of applicants for the HCHN Regional Health Administrator position, as the initial interview round elected not to move anyone forward.

She also noted that Michael Young-Hall has taken on a Special Duty assignment as Area Manager under the COVID response, planned through August. HCHN will backfill his position.

c. HCHN RFPs

Rekha Ravindran shared that the review panel for HCHN RFP – Highly Impacted Communities strategy has recommended an agency to award, and contract negotiations are underway.

She also noted that the larger HCHN RFP is planned to be released later this month, and there will be opportunities for members to participate in the review panel.

d. COVID-19 Homelessness Response

Rekha shared information on the current King County response to the COVID-19 outbreak, including mobile vaccination teams. Members were referred to the COVID-19 Homelessness Response <u>webpage</u> to stay updated.

2. HCHN Committee Updates and Actions

a. Community Advisory Group -3/3

Kristina shared that staff with the Washington State Department of Health returned to share updates and solicit additional feedback about COVID-19 vaccination planning. Katherine Switz made motion to approve the CAG Membership Roster – Feb 2021, Jesus Rodriguez seconded; vote was unanimous in favor of the motion.

- b. Executive Committee 3/3
 - i. GC Advocacy Efforts

Jesse Rawlins shared thoughts around developing a specific committee focused on advocacy, and assessed member interests in participating. King County Councilmember Joe McDermott is planning to join the March GC meeting, and members are welcome to send Rekha any questions in advance.

c. Program Evaluation Committee – 4/21

Janice shared that the PEC reviewed Public Health's progress at meeting UDS targets and new on-line dashboards depicting Public Health 330h visit and patient/demographics data.

d. Racial Equity Workgroup – 3/8

Eleta shared that the workgroup is focusing on the Network priority related to hiring, recruitment, and retention, and plans to present in more detail at the March GC meeting.

e. Behavioral Health Workgroup – TBD

Katherine shared that the workgroup is drafting a letter highlighting the need for BH services.

3. Open Forum

The King County Department of Community and Human Services will offer 25 additional emergency shelter beds at the SODO Campus located in the Seattle International District in light of forecasted below freezing temperatures and snow. The shelter will be open Tuesday night, February 9th – Saturday night, February 13th.
