

# STEP UP AGAINST FENTANYL

HERE ARE 3 LIFE-SAVING STEPS **EVERYONE** CAN TAKE:

## 1 ALWAYS, ALWAYS, ALWAYS CARRY NALOXONE

Use your phone camera to find free and confidential naloxone in King County.



Fentanyl is a very strong opioid. An amount about the size of 2 grains of salt can cause a deadly overdose within seconds of hitting your system. Fentanyl is mixed into pills and powders, meaning that ANY street pill, line, bump, or hit could be the one that causes an overdose—even if another one didn't. Thankfully, there's a **FREE and LEGAL** emergency medication that's available privately. Naloxone can reverse opioid overdoses.

## 2 LEARN HOW TO USE IT RIGHT NOW

Overdoses can happen fast, but you can save a friend's life. Learn how to administer naloxone ahead of time to make sure you're ready. NOTE: Naloxone reverses overdoses, but it's not the **ONLY** medical attention someone will need. Always call 911, and remember the Good Samaritan law: *If you seek medical assistance in a drug-related overdose, you and the victim cannot be prosecuted for drug possession.*

PEEL



PEEL BACK THE PACKAGE TO REMOVE THE DEVICE. HOLD THE DEVICE WITH YOUR THUMB ON THE BOTTOM OF THE PLUNGER AND 2 FINGERS ON THE NOZZLE.

PLACE



PLACE AND HOLD THE TIP OF THE NOZZLE IN EITHER NOSTRIL UNTIL YOUR FINGERS TOUCH THE BOTTOM OF THE PERSON'S NOSE.

PRESS



PRESS THE PLUNGER FIRMLY TO RELEASE THE DOSE INTO THE PERSON'S NOSE.

## 3 YOU COULD SAVE YOUR FRIEND'S LIFE

When someone overdoses, they're not able to administer naloxone to themselves. Just like designated drivers save people from getting in car accidents, **YOU** can save people from overdosing accidents. Let friends know that you carry naloxone, because friends don't let friends use alone.
