Offers new glasses to low-income persons, including those with Apple Health insurance and no hardware benefit. Frames are chosen from a select group which have been gifted to this program by the parent company. Eligibility: Requires letter or voucher from a non-profit agency which has a tax ID number or through Public Health - Seattle & King County. Must have a current prescription for glasses.

UpLift NW (formerly Millionaire's Club)	2515 Western Avenue	Seattle	(206) 686-2759	Open Tuesdays to anyone over 18 with no medical insurance. Appointment times are between 9am and 12pm. ID is required. No referral needed. Call to make an appointment. They will take some walk ins. Providing both vision exam and glasses. If someone has a valid prescription less than a year old, they will provide just the glasses.
