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AN ORDINANCE proposing to amend the King County

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Charter to grant the Office of Law Enforcement Oversight

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subpoena powers; amending Section 265 of the King

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County Charter, and submitting the same to the voters of

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the county for their ratification or rejection at the

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November 2020 general election.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

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SECTION 1. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of King County for

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their approval and ratification or rejection, at the next general election to be held in this

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county occurring more than 45 days after the enactment of this ordinance, an amendment

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to Section 265 of the King County Charter to read as follows:

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Section 265. Office of Law Enforcement Oversight.

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The county council shall establish by ordinance an office of law enforcement

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oversight, which shall be a part of the legislative branch. The office shall have a director

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who is appointed by a majority of the county council to serve a term of four years and

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until a successor is appointed. The director may be removed from office at any time for

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cause by a majority of the county council.

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The authority of the office of law enforcement oversight shall be prescribed by

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ordinance and should include: investigation, review and analysis of conduct of county

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law enforcement officers that has been the subject of a complaint and the use of force by

22 county law enforcement officers regardless of whether it has been the subject of a
23 complaint; and review and analysis of internal investigations conducted and disciplinary
24 action taken by the department of public safety regarding that conduct or use of
25 force. The authority of the office should also include: the preparation and publication of
26 findings, conclusions and recommendations related to the office's oversight of the
27 department of public safety; and community outreach concerning the department of
28 public safety and the office of law enforcement oversight.

29 To enable the office of law enforcement oversight to exercise its authority
30 effectively, the office shall be authorized by ordinance to obtain all relevant information,
31 including authority to review and copy relevant department of public safety files,
32 subpoena witnesses, documents and other evidence relating to its investigations or
33 review, inspect crime scenes, conduct interviews and participate in internal investigations
34 and review hearings.

35 The county council shall establish by ordinance an advisory committee for law
36 enforcement oversight to review, advise and report on the office of law enforcement
37 oversight in a manner that may be prescribed by ordinance. The committee shall also
38 advise the sheriff and the council on matters of equity and social justice related to law
39 enforcement. The committee may also advise the sheriff and the council on systemic
40 problems and opportunities for improvement in the law enforcement practices of the
41 department of public safety. The county council shall prescribe by ordinance the
42 committee's membership, qualifications, and rules and procedures, and the process for
43 appointment of committee members, and may prescribe by ordinance additional duties of
44 the committee.

45 SECTION 2. The clerk of the council shall certify the proposition to the manager
46 of the elections division, in substantially the following form, with such additions,
47 deletions or modifications as may be required by the prosecuting attorney:
