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Investigating sudden, violent, unexpected and suspicious deaths that come under the jurisdiction of the King County Medical Examiner. This is the first and second level of a three-level classification series. This classification is distinguished from other classifications in that the incumbent works predominantly with field investigations and acts as a liaison between the King County Medical Examiner's office and outside agencies, families and the public with regard to death investigation.

#### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS ACCORDING TO THE EMPLOYER:**

- 1. Investigate and collect information relating to cause and manner of death.
- 1. Answer telephones to gather information to assume or decline death jurisdiction; respond to inquiries from media, investigative agencies, public, families, etc.
- 2. Respond via telephone or scene response to deaths where jurisdiction is assumed.
- 3. Investigate death scene; record scene observations, photo-document death scene and remains and interview witnesses.
- 4. Transport bodies, evidence and personal effects to Medical Examiners Office from death site.
- 5. Initiate identification process.
- 6. Locate and notify next of kin or legal representative.
- 7. Determine disposition of body, make visual examination of body if appropriate.
- 8. Collect, record and safeguard property and evidence; release to next of kin or appropriate investigative agency.
- 9. Transport and/or arrange transportation of remains in varying degrees of decomposition to the King County Medical examiner's office and process remains including weighing, fingerprinting and examining.
- 10. Locate and collect lab samples and record, including healthcare, police and other records.
- 11. Facilitate organ donation if appropriate.
- 12. Use computer to enter data and write report of investigation.
- 13. Facilitate disposition of remains, which may include burial, transit and cremation permits.
- 14. Conduct follow-up investigation for unresolved issues such as identification, notification and information regarding manner and cause of death.

#### **EXPERIENCE, QUALIFICATIONS, KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS:**

Ability to work in hazardous environments that may include biohazards, guns, accident scenes, traffic, and direct contact with body fluids. Ability to cope with strong, offensive odors. Ability to work with mutilated and decomposed human bodies, work in isolation, and work in a graveyard shift while staying alert. Ability to work in the dark at hazardous sites in unfamiliar settings. Ability to work with extreme emotions and unpredictable

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behavior from family or other people at death site. Ability to multitask under pressure and to communicate clearly with people in a stressful situation including family of deceased, strangers, police, coworkers, etc

#### Machines, Tools, Special Equipment, Personal Protective Equipment Used:

Computer, King County response vehicle, stretcher/gurney, body bag, sheet, camera, flashlight, pager, scene kit, various pieces of evidence, reference books, log books, telephone, medical records, folders, and fingerprinting kit. The employee may also use a low friction sheet of plastic called a sked to aid in the dragging of bodies.
