US EPA President's Environmental Youth and Educator Awards	Youth awards (PEYA) recognize young people in grades K-12 for environmental stewardship projects. EPA Region 10 selects one regional winner for grades K-5 and one for grades 6-12. Projects may include but are not limited to tree planting, restoring native habitats, renewable energy, and creating skits, videos, and newsletters about the environment. Student projects must be sponsored by at least one adult over the age of 21 and each project must be sponsored or co-sponsored by a teacher. 	Educator awards (PIAEE) recognize K-12 teachers who employ innovative approaches to environmental education in a variety of areas, including but not limited to climate change, environmental justice, reducing food waste, healthy school environments, reducing ocean and marine litter, recycling solutions, using STEM to teach environmental education, and sustainable agricultural practices. Up to two teachers from each EPA region will be selected to receive an award up to \$2,500 for professional development in environmental education.

Award categories: (1) Seed Awards to integrate sustainability lessons into curriculum or start school waste reduction and recycling programs. Includes funding for milk dispensers to reduce milk waste and reusable utensils or trays; (2) Sustainable School Program Awards for ongoing efforts to support and expand waste reduction, composting, and recycling practices, including continuation of past efforts; and (3) Creative Curriculum Awards to create original curricula to inspire environmental stewardship and to introduce students, teachers, staff, and administrators to concepts of waste reduction, composting, recycling, green chemistry, sustainable design, or circular economy.
