**King County Notice of Upcoming Construction Contracting
Opportunity South Magnolia CSO Project- Conveyance System**

The King County Department of Natural Resources and Parks –Wastewater Treatment Division is in design of the South Magnolia Sewer Overflow (CSO) project located in the Magnolia neighborhood of Seattle, WA. To provide an opportunity for exchange of information and ideas between the County and interested parties, the County will be convening outreach meetings regarding this project prior to advertisement for bids. These meetings will occur in 2012 and 2013.

The project consists of **three main elements**:

- An underground diversion structure located in the 32nd Avenue W right-of-way
- Approximately 3,000 linear feet of gravity pipeline installed by trenchless construction techniques connecting to a lower diversion structure near the 23rd Avenue W right-of-way
- An underground storage tank in the Port of Seattle Terminal 91 West yard.

The County is considering two contracts, one for the conveyance system and one for the tank. **This outreach meeting will focus on the conveyance system.** The current design considers allowing two trenchless construction methods for the conveyance system. These methods are Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) and Direct Pipe (DP). A contract for this work will be advertised in 3rd quarter of 2013 or the 4th quarter of 2013. The preliminary construction cost is estimated to be in the range of \$5 million to \$10 million.

Contractors, vendors, and suppliers are welcome to attend this first outreach meeting to become educated about the project, ask questions, and provide input regarding the County's current plan for consideration in the development of the design and specifications. The meeting will cover the following topics:

- Meet the Design Team
- Project Goals
- Overview of the Geotechnical Conditions (A CD of the current boring information will be provided)
- Project Overview of the Conveyance System
- Staging and Haul Routes
- Project Schedule
- Permits and Easements
- Community Involvement
- Procurement Plan and Schedule
- Question, Comments, Feedback

Following the meeting, King County will continue advancing the design and will update the information and requirements in a second outreach meeting in the 1st quarter of 2013.
