PAST FELONY CONVICTION?

YOU CAN STILL vote!



Voting rights are now restored immediately upon release from prison, even if you're still under community supervision or owe any court fines or fees.

Regardless of your release date, if you are: a citizen over the age of 16, a resident of Washington State for at least 30 days, and not currently incarcerated, then you are eligible to register to vote, cast your ballot, and make your voice heard.



HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE

1. ONLINE AT VOTEWA. GOV

You need a Washington State driver license or ID card for this option. If you do not have a WA ID, please use a paper form or register in-person.

2. BY MAIL WITH A PAPER FORM

Download and print a voter registration form at bit.ly/WAVoteRF. While you can register at anytime, the deadline for online and mail registrations is eight days before Election Day.

3. IN PERSON

You can register to in-person until 8 p.m. on Election Day at Elections Headquarters or any VoteCenter location. Vote Centers can be found at bit.ly/KCVoteCenter.
