- Adolescents mature at varying rates
- Youth in transition very capable at recognizing right from wrong → however, not capable of acting on that knowledge in a mature manner
- Given the complex nature of brain development it is unwise to have a one size fits all punitive justice system → specifically one that lumps transition aged youth in with mature adults

Transition Age Presentation with Familiar Faces Lens Discussion 10:45 -10:55 a.m.

- Stopping the transition age prison pipeline is of paramount importance (fits within ethos of investing upstream)
- King County Department of Public Defense working towards an initiative that resentences individuals that were charged during their adolescence
- Court system at a disadvantage → requires an immense amount of time to build the trust necessary to connect with traumatized youth (or even adults that were traumatized during their youth)
- Courts are not doing enough to help youth in our community
- Check in with BSK to glean any knowledge that they may have with regards to stopping the transition age prison pipeline

- Continue to invest upstream (focus on young adult demographic)
- Work towards creating a culture shift in Seattle Municipal Court and King County Jail w/ regards to youth
