



Complaints Reported by Community Members and Sheriff's Office Employees

Bottom line: There were four complaints reported in 2019 in District 6, and Internal Investigations Unit (IIU) classified three of those complaints as inquiries, or serious complaints. Those three complaints included six allegations of misconduct. IIU did not sustain four allegations of misconduct and sustained one allegation of misconduct for an incident where a deputy sped through a crash scene being managed by another police department. IIU has not completed one complaint investigation.


