### History of KC Farm Lease Program

## Sammamish Farm became home of Indochinese Farm Project

- Initiated in 1982
- Hmong and Mien immigrants
- KC provided land
- WSU provided technical assistance
- PPM supported marketing and sales
- Initially 6 families...today more than 70



Key Lessons Learned from Indochinese Farm Project



Immigrants and refugees often have extensive farm experience and can find successful niche in KC farming landscape



Technical and financial support is needed to help farmers get operations started



Sustained commitment to support farmers is necessary as new challenges continually arise



# History of KC Farm Lease Program

2016 Agriculture Commission Program Review

- Limit County acquisition of farmland
- Provide beginning and BIPOC farmers with term-limited access to affordable farmland
- Maintain farmland potential on lands acquired for other purposes (e.g., river/riparian restoration)

  - Identify new properties that could support I/R farmers





### **Current Leasing Program Guidelines**


- Lease at market rates
  - Determined via a market rate survey
  - o **2021:** \$450/\$350/\$80
  - o Previously: \$250/\$150/\$50
- Available plots offered to individuals who have shared plots on same farm
- Significant land offering via RFP process
- Initial 1-year lease followed by 5-year lease
- Extensions possible, but the hope is many farmers will move onto larger leases/buy their own farms

# Horseneck Farm 2022: RFP second phase of transition

- RFP widely distributed
- 5-8 acres available
- Up to 5 acres/organization; 2 acres for individual farm business
- Preference given to nonprofit/community-based organizations
- Detailed proposal instructions
- 4 internal, 4 external reviewers
- 5 proposals received

### Farmland Leasing Program Operations

- 0.8 FTE Farm Manager (Bee)
- 0.4 FTE Leasing Program Manager (Melissa)
- \$50,000 per year for farmland management
- No truck, no trailer, no tractor, etc.
