	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● When you came into this process – what are you keeping at the forefront and thinking about when making some of the recommendations that you’ve made? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Took the time to engage both at macro level and directly with community that have the highest representation of GBV and demonstrated the least access to resources and least personal privilege to navigate system or do without those resources. ○ Recommendations are specifically tailored to King County (council and Executive) and what those decision makers can do to disrupt the cycle of GBV that disproportionately impacts ○ Heard from communities most impacted AND they are written for decision makers ○ Make mental health resources available – particularly for survivors of GBV <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Lack of providers and this is an opportunity to promote availability ▪ Faith and income-based hospitals are limiting access to MH and SA services ○ Accountability programming for people doing harm ● Expanding equity framework ● Gender Based Violence is “Gender-based violence is a general term used to capture any type of violence that is rooted in exploiting unequal power relationships between genders. This can include gender norms and role expectations specific to a society as well as situational power imbalances and inequities. ● What are the 4 types of Gender Based Violence? Verbal violence, psychological violence, sexual violence. socio-economic violence. (Domestic Violence & Sexual Harassment can often contain elements of all 4 types) ● What are the 4 factors that contribute to Gender Based Violence? Cultural Factors, Political Factors, Legal Factors, and Economic Factors. ● Provide dedicated housing for survivors <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Ingersoll Gender Center did an audit of KC shelter systems (roughly 2020) ○ Discrimination of trans women as well as immigrants and refugees ○ Equity and inclusion have to be built
