In 2021 the King County [WaterWorks Grant Program](#) competitive track will award \$2.2 million for projects that protect water quality, control pollution, and build healthy communities. Projects must provide an improvement to water quality in the [Wastewater Treatment Division service area](#), and are also evaluated based on certainty of success, community involvement, and equity & social justice.

The WaterWorks Grant Team is hosting free public information sessions for potential applicants. Each information session will provide an overview of grant criteria, the application process, examples of past projects, and an opportunity to ask questions.
