If parking is full at South Training, you may park across the street in the South Operations Employee lot located just east of South Training. Please follow any restricted access or parking signs posted. If both lots are full, you may park in the South parking structure located south of South Operations.

- Other King County employees who are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine

Using leave: Follow workplace procedures for requesting time off. If your appointment is scheduled during your work shift or if you experience any side effects from the vaccine, you can use accrued sick leave or, if eligible, remaining COVID-19 Paid Administrative Leave.
