#### Sitting

Continuously on an office chair or automobile seat for up to 2.5 hours at a time for up to 8.75 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while performing computer duties, speaking with customers and driving a County vehicle to locations as far as Stevens pass.

## Climbing stairs

## Bending/Stooping

Rarely on flat carpeted and linoleum surfaces for up to 10 minutes at a time for up to 40 minutes total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while inspecting items in lower areas and traversing construction sites. The employee can alternate between bending/stooping or squatting as needed.

#### Reaching at knee to waist height

#### Reaching at floor to knee height
