JOB DESCRIPTION

Operates motorized equipment to maintain King County facilities and structures. The employees in this position pick their assignments in accordance with seniority. This particular employee primarily drives a compactor and collects garbage, but could be required to drive other equipment based upon business demand. Job analyses for other equipment will be completed upon request.

- 5. Ability to work independently or part of a team; ability to interact appropriately with others.
- 6. Ability to work with supervision, receiving instructions/feedback, coaching/counseling and/or action/discipline.



JOB SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Knowledge of driving laws, traffic control methods, automotive systems, Seattle/King County roadways and surrounding street system, operational manuals, road conditions and routes. Must possess skills in communications (oral and written), customer service, defensive driving and skill in heavy equipment operations as well as skill and mechanical aptitude in use and care of tools and equipment. Must have familiarity with and skill in using small hand tools as well as skill in operating equipment in high-density traffic under adverse weather conditions. Must have a Washington State Driver's License, Commercial Driver's License class B with air-brake endorsement and a Washington State Department of Transportation medical card. The employee must also possess a valid flagging certification.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- 1. Operates motorized equipment such as backhoe, loader, evactor, compactor, sanding truck, forklift and sweeper. Operate equipment to grade, sweep, remove, dig, ditch, build, cut, load, clean or lift.
- 2. Responds to on-site accidents, emergencies and hazardous spills to assess immediate concerns and respond to them with equipment.
- 3. Performs visual safety inspection of vehicle, checks and corrects fluid levels and tire pressure, refuels vehicles, maintains vehicle cleanliness and performs pre-trip inspections.
- 4. Identifies potentially hazardous or unacceptable materials at job site and coordinates proper disposal.
- 5. Informs, directs, monitors and control public customers and vendors.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT USED

Ear protection, eye protection, respirator, vest, boots and gloves.

OTHER TOOLS & EQUIPMENT USED

Two-way radio/cellular telephone, telephone, various hand tools, grease gun, cleaning equipment, shovel, County vehicle (pickup truck), backhoe, loader, evactor, compactor, forklift, and sweeper.

Standing

Frequently on metal, dirt, gravel, cement, mud and uneven surfaces for up to 15 minutes at a time for up to 6 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while conversing with co-workers and supervisors as well as when performing vehicle maintenance and fueling equipment. When driving the compactor the employee can either sit or stand.

Walking

Health Care Provider initials if restricted

Continuously on metal, dirt, gravel, cement and uneven surfaces for distances of up to 50 feet for up to 5 minutes at a time for up to 8 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while traversing between the compactor, shelters and garbage cans. The employee empties approximately 40-60 garbage cans and 15-30 dumpsters per shift.

Sitting

Health Care Provider initials if restricted_

Frequently on an automobile or machinery seat for up to 2 hours at a time for up to 9 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while operating a compactor. The employee can stand up or sit down when operating the compactor. Sitting will also occur while operating a backhoe, loader, sweeper, sanding truck, forklift and sweeper.

Climbing stairs

Health Care Provider initials if restricted Occasionally for up to 5 seconds at a time while climbing up to 3 steps for up to 30 minutes total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while entering and exiting equipment (1-4 steps) as well as traversing over curbs.

Climbing

Occasionally for up to 5 seconds at a time while climbing up to 3 steps for up to 20 minutes total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while entering and exiting equipment (1-4 steps).

Balancing

Frequently to continuously on uneven ground, wet leaves, loading docs, garbage and heavy machinery at heights of up to 4 feet for up to 1 hour at a time for up to 6 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while driving the compactor while standing up as well as traversing uneven ground such as curbs, garbage and slick surfaces.

Bending neck up

Health Care Provider initials if restricted Occasionally for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 30 minutes total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while inspecting equipment and stooping over to look up at stop lights while driving standing up.

Bending neck down

Health Care Provider initials if restricted Frequently for up to 1 hour at a time for up to 3-4 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while emptying garbage cans and replacing liners. Will also occur while operating a backhoe, loader, sweeper, backpack blower, sanding truck and forklift.

Bending/Stooping

Health Care Provider initials if restricted

Occasionally on cement and asphalt surfaces for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 3 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while inspecting engine compartment and greasing

Kneeling

Health Care Provider initials if restricted

Occasionally on cement and asphalt surfaces for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 3 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while inspecting engine compartment and greasing equipment as well as when emptying garbage cans and replacing liners. The employee might be able to reduce kneeling by alternating with squatting or bending/stooping.

Squatting

Health Care Provider initials if restricted

Occasionally on cement and asphalt surfaces for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 3 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while inspecting engine compartment and greasing equipment as well as when emptying garbage cans and replacing liners. The employee might be able to reduce squatting by alternating with bending/stooping or kneeling.

Operating Controls with Feet

Health Care Provider initials if restricted Continuously and highly repetitive for up to 2 hours at a time for up to 9 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while operating the compactor. Will also occur if operating a backhoe, loader, sweeper, sanding truck and forklift.

Reaching above shoulder height

Occasionally for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 2 hours total in a work shift while greasing, fueling and opening windows in machinery as well as when removing liners out of top loading garbage cans.

Reaching at waist to shoulder height

Continuously and highly repetitive for up to 2 hours at a time for up to 9 hours total in a work shift while operating the compactor. Will also occur if operating a backhoe, loader, sweeper, backpack blower, sanding truck or forklift.

Reaching at knee to waist height

Occasionally for up to 1 hour at a time for up to 2 hours total in a work shift while empting side loading garbage cans as well as when operating hand controls and levers on the sweeper and backhoe.

Reaching at floor to knee height

Occasionally on cement and asphalt surfaces for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 30 minutes total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while inspecting and greasing equipment as well as when picking garbage up off of the ground.

Lifting 1-10 pounds

Health Care Provider initials if restricted

Occasionally for up to 1 minute at a time for up to 10 minutes total in a work shift while manipulating various hand tools, bags of garbage, shovel and equipment parts.

Lifting 51-100 pounds

Health Care Provider initials if restricted Occasionally for up to 5 minutes at a time for up to 2 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs with weights of 51-80 pounds while emptying garbage cans.

Carrying 51-100 pounds

Occasionally to frequently for distances of up to 20 feet for up to 20 seconds at a time for up to 2 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs with weights of 51-80 pounds while emptying garbage cans in to the compactor.

Pushing and Pulling

Health Care Provider initials if restricted Continuously and highly repetitive for up to 2 hours at a time with 10-50 pounds of force for up to 9 hours total in a work shift while operating hand controls (up to15 pounds for hydraulic levers) and steering wheel (10 pounds) on machinery as well as when removing garbage bags from side load cans and manipulating rolling dumpsters (50-100+ pounds).

Handling

Health Care Provider initials if restricted_

Occasionally for distances of up to 100 feet for up to 3 minutes at a time for up to 15 minutes total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs with weights of 1-4 pounds while transporting hand tools, shovel and equipment parts to and from equipment.

Lifting 11-20 pounds

Fingering

Continuously and highly repetitive for up to 2 hours at a time for up to 9 hours total in a work shift while operating controls and levers on the compactor as well as when unlocking garbage cans. Will also occur if operating a backhoe, loader, sweeper, sanding truck and forklift. Finger controls consist of keys, various small levers, buttons and switches.

Feeling

Health Care Provider initials if restricted_

Continuously for up to 2 hours at a time for up to 11 hours total in a work shift while identifying equipment failure through unusual vibrations.

Talking

Continuously for up to 5 minutes at a time with for up to 1 hour in a work shift while using a radio, communicating with supervisors, base chief and co-workers.

Hearing

Health Care Provider initials if restricted

Continuously for up to 2 hours at a time for up to 11 hours total in a work shift while identifying equipment failure and potential hazards.

Seeing

Health Care Provider initials if restricted_ Continuously for up to 2.5 hours at a time for up to 11 hours total in a work shift. Most commonly occurs while operating the compactor. Will also occur if operating a backhoe, loader, compactor, sanding truck, forklift and sweeper. The employee is continuously exposed to the general public, so the employee uses vision to identify potential hazards.

Working with Heightened Awareness

Continuously for up to 2.5 hours at a time for up to 11 hours total in a work shift. The employee is continuously exposed to the general public during night hours, in at risk areas and at time unpleasant areas thought King County, so the employee must be able identify potential hazards. Garbage receptacles can also contain potentially harmful objects such as broken glass, contaminated needles and biohazard waste.

ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

Work is performed at various transportation settings with direct exposure to the elements while operating the backpack blower. The employee is continuously exposed to the general public at night, which may include potentially hostile persons. The employee is also exposed to garbage which can contain potentially harmful objects such as broken glass, contaminated needles and biohazard waste. The employee is continuously exposed to moving machinery, which includes bouncing and vibration. Equipment operation is performed during adverse weather conditions, which may
