King County Superior Court 2019 Annual Statistical Report

2019 Highlights

This annual statistical report presents information on filings, resolutions, pending caseload, and trials in King County Superior Court (KCSC). Because of the year-end update and adjustment, a slight difference may exist between the statistics in this annual report and the statistics in the quarterly reports.

- Filings (Table 1). The total number of cases filed in 2019 was essentially the same as that in 2018 (+0.1%), increasing by only 48 cases. In 2019, the total filings (including "Matters Filed with Clerk") were 62,919 cases. Total judicial filings (after excluding "Matters Filed with Clerk") decreased by 1.8% from 2018, totaling 52,889 cases. However, the change in filings was non-uniform across case categories. In 2019, criminal filings were higher than that in 2018. The criminal filings (excluding criminal appeals) were 6,607 cases in 2019, showing a 10.3% increase from 2018. General civil filings (case type 2, excluding "Matters Filed with Clerk" and civil RALJ) in 2019 were lower than that in 2018 (-4.6%). Domestic filings (case type 3) in 2019 was also lower than that in 2018 (-4.7%). Involuntary Treatment Act (ITA) filings increased slightly again in 2019 and continued the upward pattern, totaling 4,985 cases (+75 cases from 2018). In 2019, noticeable decrease in filings was observed in the following categories: guardianship (-27.7%), juvenile BECCA (-29.5%), juvenile termination (-34.6%), and juvenile offender (-8.8%).
- Resolutions (Table 2). The total resolutions (including "Matters Filed with Clerk") in 2019 were 61,812 cases, a 2.1% increase from 2018. The resolutions were notably lower than the filings in 2019 in the following categories: criminal cases, juvenile offender, and juvenile dependency cases. No significant gap between filings and resolutions was observed for other categories in 2019.
- <u>Pending Caseload</u> (Table 3). The overall pending caseload at the end of 2019 was 22,146 cases, showing an increase from that at the end of 2018 (+3%). At the end of 2019, significant increase in pending caseload was observed in criminal (+414 cases), general civil (+333 cases), and juvenile offender cases (+183 cases).
- <u>Trials</u>. Overall, there were 343 jury trials in 2019. There were 607 non-jury trials in 2019. These trial numbers were comparable to that in both 2017 and 2018. In addition, there were 179 other trials (mistrials, trial by affidavit and stipulated trials) in 2019.
- MRJC vs. SEA (Table 4). Of the total 62,919 cases (including Matters filed with the Clerk) filed in 2019, 37% were MRJC cases. However, no cases in the following categories were assigned to MRJC: involuntary treatment act and juvenile offender. The MRJC resolutions (38%, as a percentage of total resolution in KCSC) in 2019 were comparable to the filings at MRJC (37% of the total filings). At the end of 2019, the MRJC pending caseload was 37% of that of the entire court, including all case categories. In 2019, MRJC accounted for 39%, 45%, and 42% of total criminal, civil and domestic case filings, respectively.



Resolution

A case is resolved if all issues in the complaint are fully adjudicated.

Suspended Case

A case is placed in suspense status from active status during the reporting period.

Suspense Status

A case is on suspense status if it is on warrant, appeal, stay, mediation, arbitration ("Deferred Prosecution" is not a suspense status, but is treated as a resolution).

Trial

A hearing set before a judge or jury in which all the issues in the case are meant to be resolved. A trial normally includes opening statements to the court or jury stating what evidence will show, introduction of witnesses and exhibits for direct and cross examination, final arguments to the court or jury in which counsel argue both the evidence and the law, and judgment by the court or jury stating what the facts of the case are and what law applies to the facts. In a jury case, it also includes the selection of the jury. A trial can be held for one or more cases. A single trial may be held to adjudicate more than one case (as defined above).
