EMERGENCY TEMPORARY ORDER
REGARDING SERVICE OF
CERTAIN OUTSTANDING
DISTRICT COURT WARRANTS AT
LOCAL JAIL FACILITIES

This matter is before the Court relating to the release of persons with outstanding bench warrants issued by King County District Court.

1. <u>RELEASE WITH WARRANT OUTSTANDING</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that all persons with a warrant of arrest who meet the following criteria (A-C) will not be booked into the King County Correctional Facility (King County Jail or KCJ), SCORE, Issaquah City Jail.

The determination of eligibility for this criteria shall be made by a commissioned correctional officer (KCJ, Issaquah) or Operations Captain (SCORE).

- A. The warrant was issued out of the King County District Court or a municipality under contract with the King County District Court to include Auburn, Bellevue, Beaux Arts, Burien, Covington, Duvall, Kenmore, Redmond, Sammamish, Shoreline, Skykomish, and Vashon Island; and
- B. The bail amount for the warrant is under \$10,000.00; and
- C. The warrant is <u>not</u> for a matter involving the charge of DUI; Physical Control; any domestic violence offense; or violation of an anti-harassment, no contact, restraining order or protection order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that if these criteria are met, as determined by the appropriate commissioned corrections officer or Operations Captain referenced above, the defendant shall be released, and the bench warrant shall remain outstanding. The corrections officer or Operations Captain shall inform the defendant that he/she must contact the District Court to address the warrant upon the court resuming operations on the matter.
