FELONY FIREARM OFFENDER REGISTRATION. RCW 9.41. The defendant has been convicted or found not guilty by reason of insanity of a felony firearm offense as defined in RCW 9.41.010 (any felony violation of chapter 9.41 RCW, drive-by shooting, theft of a firearm under RCW 9A.56.300, possession of a stolen firearm under RCW 9A.56.310, any felony offense committed while armed with a firearm) and the judge has ordered registration.

If you reside in Washington, you are required to personally register with the sheriff of the county where you reside, whether or not you have a fixed residence.

You are required to provide the following information at the time of registration: Name and aliases used; complete residence address, or where you plan to stay if you lack a fixed residence; identifying information, including a physical description; your firearm offense; date and place of conviction; names of any other county where you have registered as a firearm offender. The county sheriff may require documentation to verify this information.

You must register within 48 hours after your release from custody resulting from the felony firearm offense. If you are not sentenced to confinement, you must register within 48 hours of being sentenced.

If you change your residence within the same county, you must update the contents of your current registration no later than 48 hours after the change of address. **If you move to a new county within this state,** you must personally register with the sheriff for that county no later than 48 hours after the change of address.

You must register with the county sheriff **no later than 20 days after each 12-month anniversary of the date you were first required to register.** If you are in custody or confined in another state facility or a health care facility throughout the 20-day period for re-registration, you must personally appear before the county sheriff no later than 48 hours after release to verify and update your registration.

The duty to register continues for 4 years after the date you are first required to register. Failure to comply with these registration requirements is a crime.
