



## Recommendation 1

DONE



The Wastewater Treatment Division should update its risk based analysis of the adequacy of contingency to include 'Buy American Steel,' Seattle Department of Transportation improvements, and other recently identified cost risks.

STATUS UPDATE: In cost estimates for four construction contracts at the 90 percent design level and in WTD's project risk register, we found that WTD addressed the elements of this recommendation. For example, WTD included \$1.3 million in American steel/iron costs and \$300,000 for Seattle Department of Restoration requirements in its 90 percent design cost estimate for the project. This has improved clarity and transparency on costs associated with these risks.
