

#### **Evergreen Treatment Services**



**Service Type:** Opioid Treatment Program

Capacity: 500 Outpatient Clients

**Location**: Kent


**Opening Date:** August 2016

County Investment: \$1,000,000

Why is this investment necessary? This program was added to address two issues, a lack of service capacity resulting in long waitlists and a lack of service providers in south King County, resulting in 500+ clients travelling to downtown Seattle for treatment.

**Result:** Waitlist nearly eliminated, Medicaid travel costs reduced, and expanded system capacity amidst opioid epidemic.




**Opening Date:** 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2018

Why is this investment necessary? Geriatric patients with dementia or Alzheimer's disease are often detained in the mental health system. We need a treatment option designed to meet the additional needs of these patients and their families.

**Result:** More appropriate patient placement will result in better outcomes, and a new facility will increase system capacity.

#### **Telecare**



**Service Type:** Evaluation and Treatment

Capacity: 16 Beds

**Location:** Federal Way

**Opening Date:** November 2017

County Investment: \$3,231,000

Why is this investment necessary? This program was added to address a lack of system capacity that has resulted in patients not receiving psychiatric services in an environment of care conducive to recovery.

**Expected Result:** Treatment on demand for psychiatric patients needing hospitalization in an appropriate setting.



**Service Type:** Co-occurring Residential

Capacity: 45 Beds

**Location:** Seattle

**Opening Date:** November 2017

County Investment: \$864,939 (combined

with VCC Seattle Detox)

Why is this investment necessary? This program was added to address the lack of system capacity for patients requiring co-occurring treatment. The vast majority of patients needing these services have had to leave King County.

**Expected Result:** Treatment on demand will eliminate waitlists, and patients will not have to leave community support to receive treatment.


