MIDD SERVICE IMPROVEMENT PLAN MODIFICATIONS

- ✓ King County's MIDD is a countywide 0.1% sales tax generating an about \$136 million per two-year biennium, specifically for programs and services for people living with or at risk of behavioral health conditions.
- ✓ MIDD is managed and operated by the King County Department of Community and Human Services' <u>Behavioral Health and Recovery Division</u>.

- ✓ In 2016, the MIDD Advisory Committee (AC) shaped MIDD 2 Service Improvement Plan (SIP) over the course of several months through extensive review, discussion and feedback on the SIP recommendations
- ✓ The 2016 SIP contains an Initiative Revision Decision Flow Chart that amended thresholds of when changes need AC consultation, review and comments
- ✓ In 2017, at the AC's request BHRD staff developed, with the Steering Committee and the AC, an enhanced process for AC review of MIDD modifications

NEW INITIATIVES

✓ Based on the SIP new initiatives, should only be added if revenue greatly outpaces projections for a sustained period.

This process will be triggered once:

- a) Current systems are stably funded
- b) A rainy day reserve of 60 days is achieved, and
- c) A sizable allocation amount has been accrued.

- ✓ Once MIDD revenues greatly outpace projections for a sustained period, and that economic adjustments can continue for existing initiative providers, BHRD, in collaboration with the MIDD Advisory Committee, may elect to initiate a new initiative process. When these conditions have been met the SIP recommends:
 - A fund balance work group approach, or
 - A new concept approach
- ✓ At this point the conditions have not been met to add new initiatives.
- ✓ This method is designed to ensure programs have stable, ongoing funding and a strategic approach is used to add programs that will achieve MIDD policy goals.
