3. Items with a wide variability in results (participants rating it very differently) are highlighted in *italic* at the bottom of each theme slide, and could be discussed

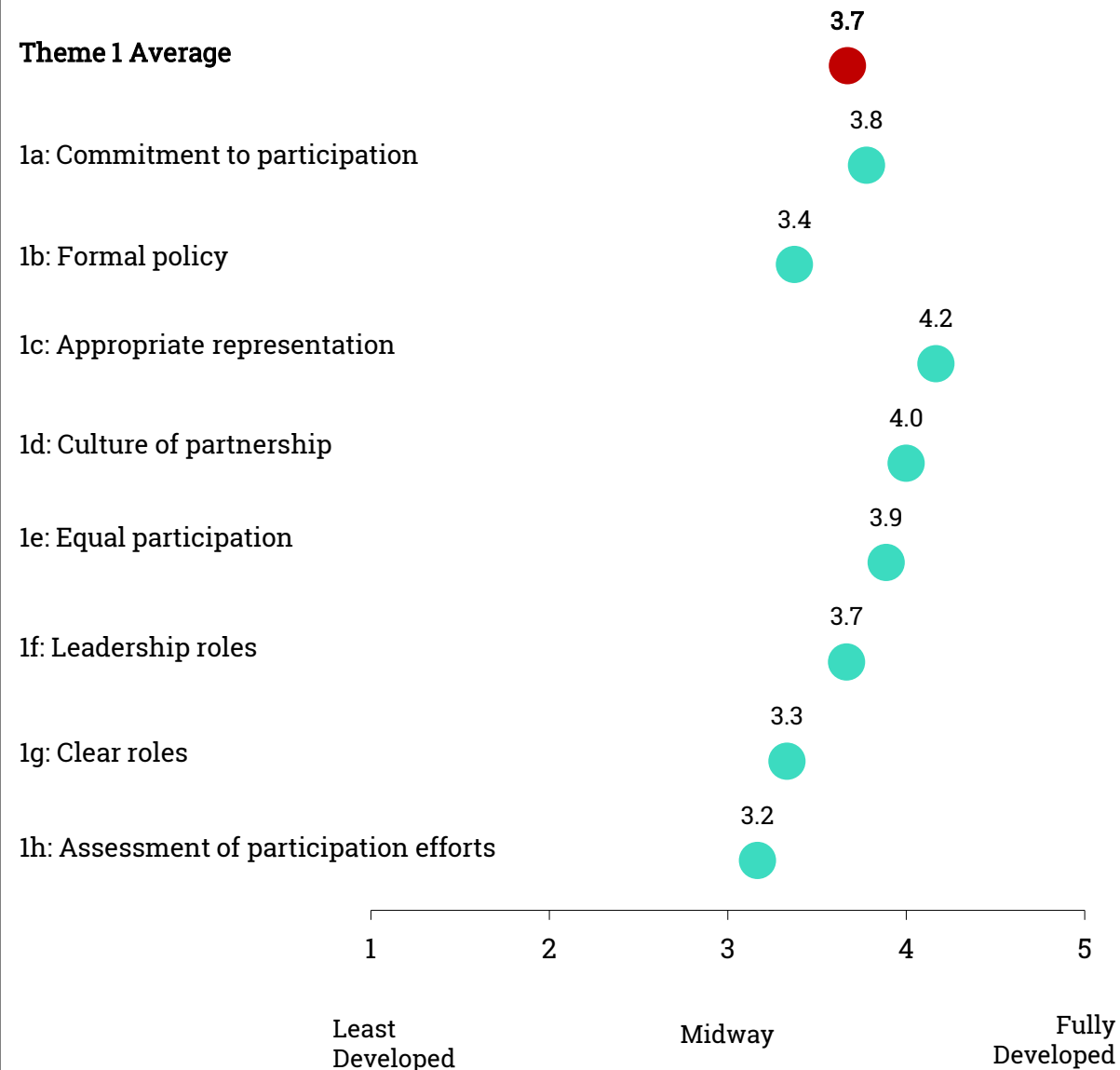
Average by theme

Theme 1: Overall vision and commitment

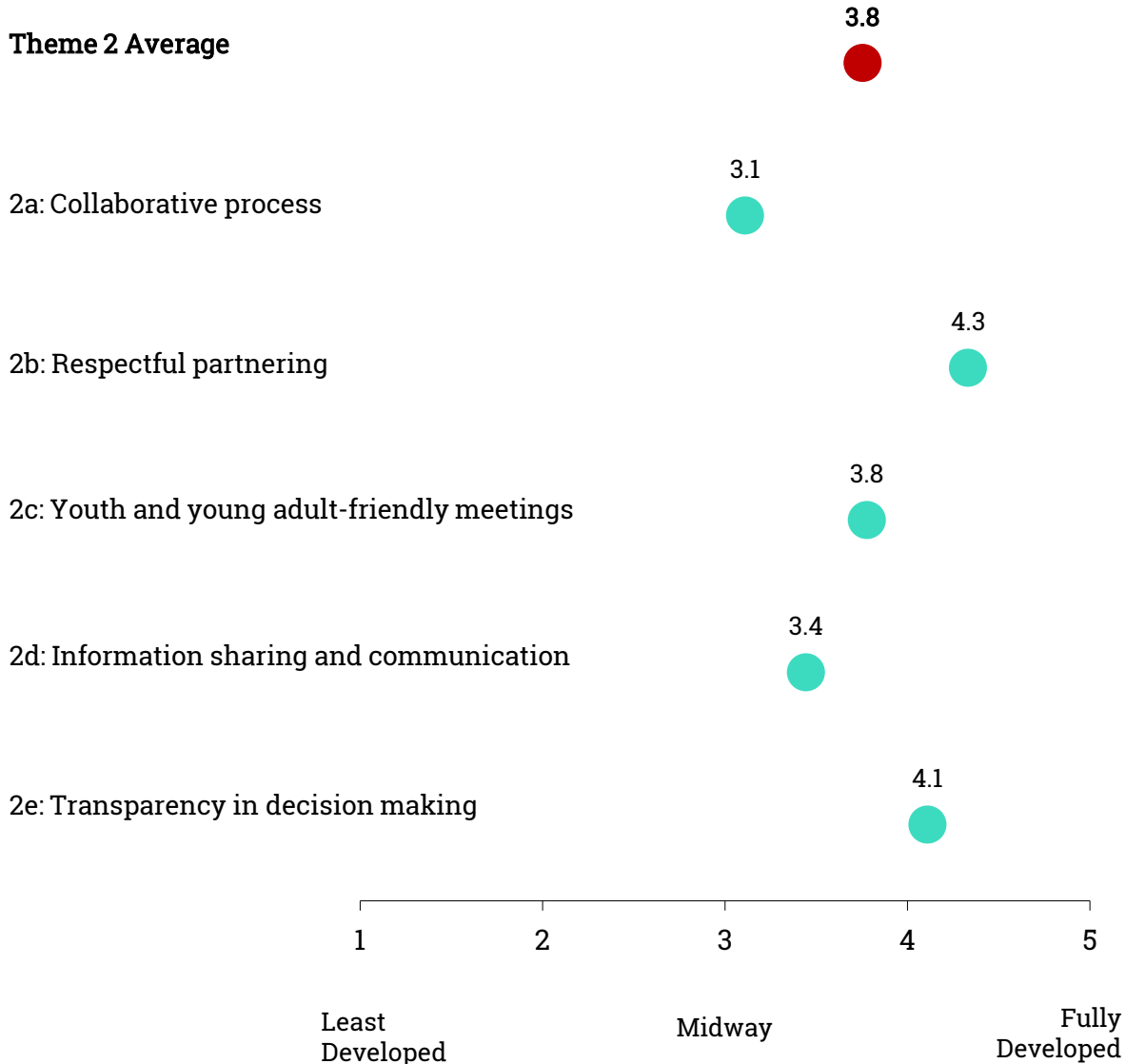


Theme 1

Theme 2: Collaborative approach

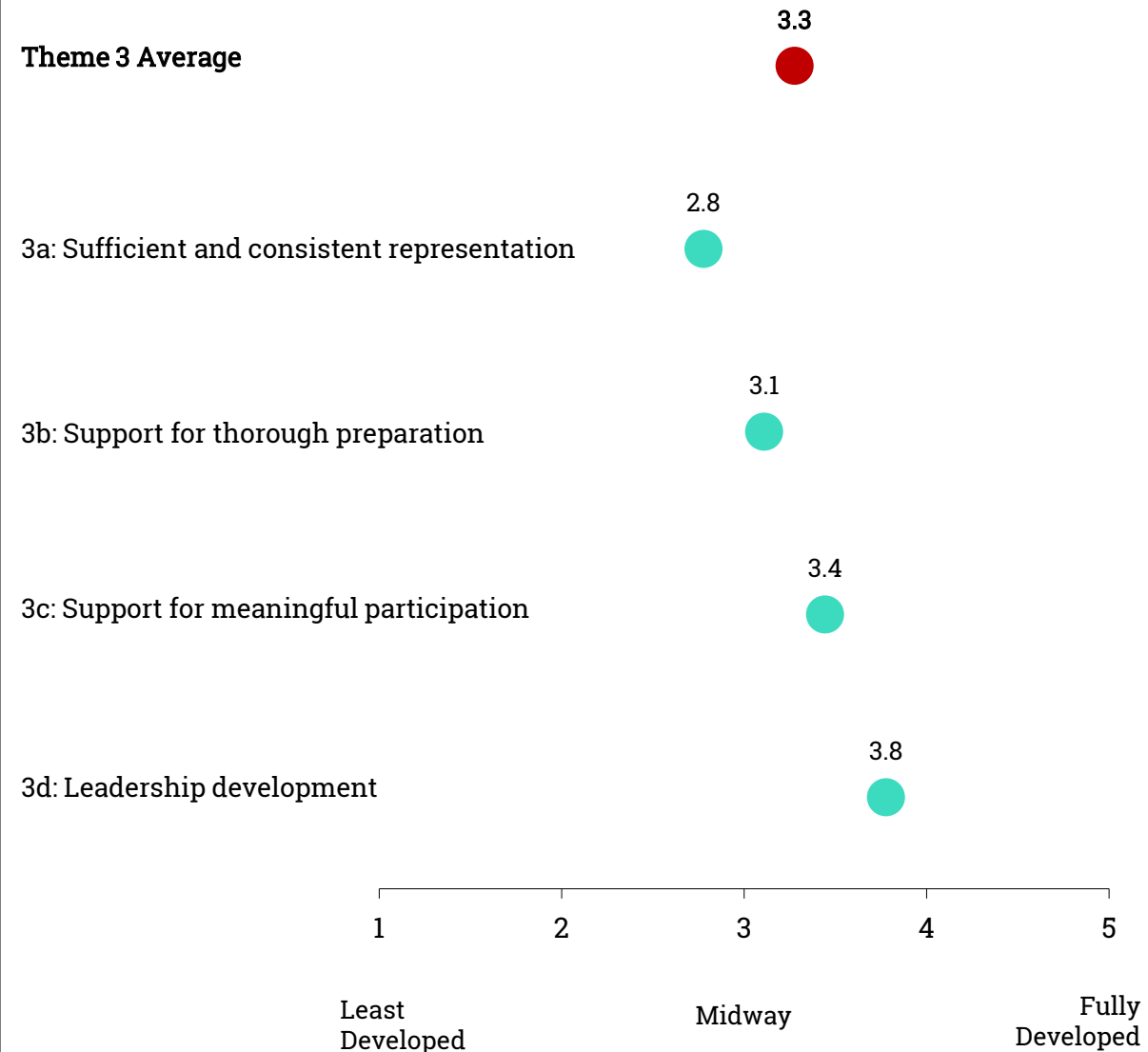

High variance: 2a, 2d

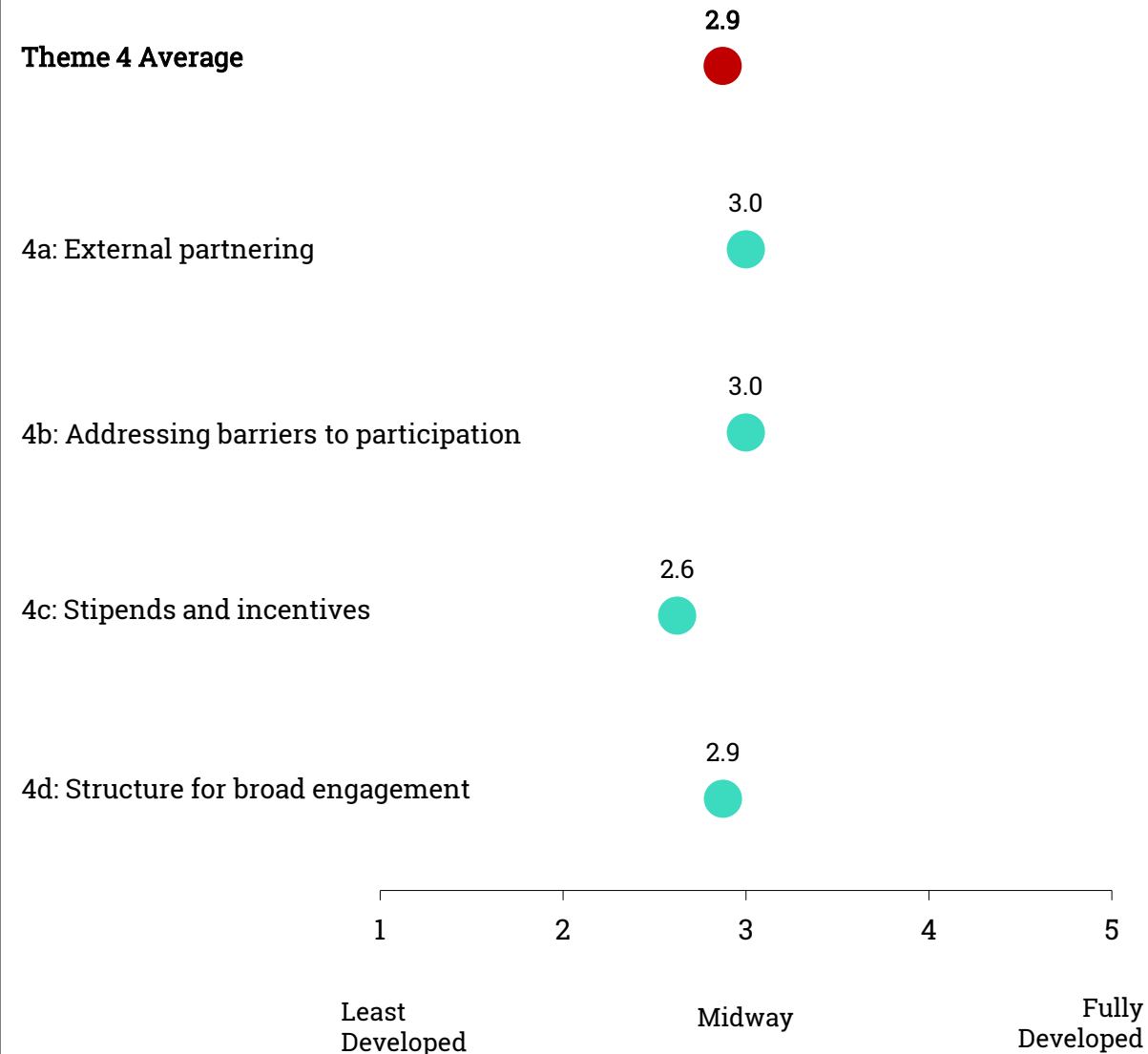
Theme 3: Empowered representatives
