WELCOME AND BOARD ROLE CALL

The Board for Developmental Disabilities meeting convened at 9:36 a.m. on Wednesday, May 5, 2021, via Zoom. The Board Chair, Theresa-Ann Clark, called the meeting to order with welcoming remarks.

Theresa-Ann Clark, Chair provided a Native Land Acknowledgement and also acknowledged the history of Asian-American and Asian-American Pacific Islander contributions in our region as well as noted the history of internment.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Theresa-Ann Clark, Chair called for a motion to approve the April 7, 2021, Minutes. The Minutes were so moved, seconded and approved as written.

SHARING OF BOARD MEMBER AND COMMUNITY INFORMATION

- Theresa-Ann Clark, Chair opened up this section with an icebreaker for board members as a prompt to share information about their work.
- Anquida Adams, Vice Chair, spoke about her collaboration with Board member, Joe Cunningham regarding housing issues.

- Joe Cunningham, Board Member shared he is working with Anquida on outreach efforts regarding housing.
- Leo Finnegan, Board Member shared several items:
 - Life Enrichment Options is still waiting on the groundbreaking of their fifth adult family home in the Highlands.
 - There is a proposal to reverse property tax exemption for homes that serve people with developmental disabilities. This is concerning for many as some homes adult family homes will need to go back and review their past tax records.
- Steve Andrews, Board Member shared the following:
 - Writing a book based on his social model of emotional wellbeing
 - Exploring graduate level work in pediatric psychology with a focus on developmental traumatology
- Mary Sheely, Northwest Center shared information on an event to mark the 50th anniversary of the passage of Washington State House Bill 90 Education for All, the first U.S. law to grant public education to people with disabilities. - Laura Musso Escude, Community Member expressed an interest in becoming a Board member. Her focus will be changing infrastructure for caregiver support in the developmental disabilities community.

BYLAW REVISIONS

Jim Ott, Developmental Disabilities and Early Childhood Supports Division (DDECSD) presented on proposed revisions to the current Board bylaws. Jim noted that in February 2021, Rick Ybarra assisted in a review of the bylaws needed to hold an elections. During his review, Rick was able to identify that many of the Board bylaws were outdated, narrow, or out of scope. In response to this Theresa appointed an ad-

hoc committee to develop recommendations on suggested revisions. On Friday April 30, 2021, the committee sent out a revised bylaw document with suggested revisions for the Board to adopt. It is the recommendation of the ad-hoc committee to accept the proposed revisions to the Boards Bylaws in amending the bylaws

Theresa-Ann Clark, Chair called for discussion on the proposed revisions to the bylaws.

- Leo Finnegan motioned for an amendment to the revised Section XII: Amendments. Leo shared that he felt that language in the current bylaws was stronger and that the new version would allow room for manipulation.
- This motion was not seconded. The motion failed.

Theresa-Ann then called for a motion to accept the proposed revisions to the current bylaws.

• Motion to accept revised bylaws in full was moved and seconded. Steve, Anquida, Jason, and Joe were in favor with an audible, "Aye." Leo abstained. Majority in favor of passing proposal.






