## What's Going On?

## **Vaccine Update**

**VACCINE Q&A WITH DOH** | The Department of Health hosted a Q&A for its staff on the science of COVID vaccines with Dr. Scott Lindquist, Acting State Health Officer and State Infectious Disease Epidemiologist and Kathy Bay, RN Clinical Vaccine Expert. Staff had a chance to ask a wide variety of questions specifically about the vaccine, infections, reactions to vaccine, etc. DOH has given permission to share this video widely as a resource. ## From the Early Childhood Team:

Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) launched our Family Engagement Experts and Leaders (FEEL) group in July! Shanelle Dodson-Dance recruited 10 families, and has held the first two meetings, with both Cantonese and Spanish interpreters supporting the group! Some FEEL members will be joining DD Board Meetings, including today. We are still seeking more parents/caregivers to join the year-long commitment to FEEL and strengthen family support within the ESIT system.

Workforce Development + Developmental Promotion have held exciting trainings recently, including "Understanding and Uplifting Immigrant Families" and "Positionality & Cultural Humility when Working with Families."



Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health strategy activities have included:

- Ongoing support for the 80+ community members involved in the Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) Community of Leaders for Reflective Capacity;
- Providing "Developing a Father Friendly System of Services with Cross Cultural Perspectives" training; and,
- King County's Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Landscape Analysis and Strategic Plan is in the "design" phase—and will be available soon!

### From the Adult Services Team:

**School-to-Work Update** | S2W continues to support students who graduated in June 2021 move to long term employment support through DDA. Currently 85 students (2021 graduates) have moved onto long term support through DDA, with more in progress. 46 students (2021 graduates) obtained jobs and 42 of those are still working. There are 113 students currently participating in the S2W Program who will exit school in June 2022.

## From the Community Information Outreach and Referral Team:

**Board Member Update** | CIOR staff are refining the internal process to appoint community members to serve on the Board. The goal is to speed up the time it takes to appoint community members to the Board.

A community member has applied to serve on the Board and their application has been moved forward in the appointment process. Currently there are three community members in the process of being appointed to serve on the Board.



**Legislative Committee Meetings** | The King County Developmental Disabilities Legislative Committee meetings will help the King County Developmental Disabilities and Early Childhood Supports Division develop our 2022 Legislative Agenda to be presented at our annual legislative forum.

The first Legislative Committee meeting was on August 26<sup>th</sup>. The Committee discussed the needs most frequently mentioned at our listening sessions with Black, Indigenous, and People of Color and People with Disabilities communities. The committee proposed different ways we can meet these needs. For our second committee meeting on September 9<sup>th</sup>, we will review the list of proposed action items and decide which ones could be legislative requests.


**School-to-Work Update:**S2W continues to work with students who graduated in June 2021 move to long term employment support through DDA. (I will see if we can add some numbers to share as well).
