The Board's February Agenda and December Minutes will be distributed at the end of January.

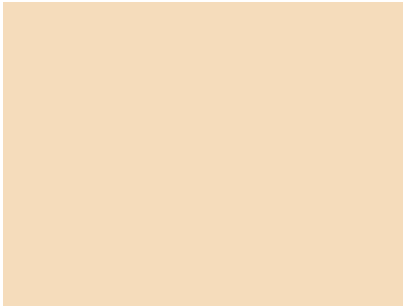

The 2023 Washington State legislative session is just around the corner! The state legislature meets each year for either 60 days in even-numbered years or 105 days in odd-numbered years. Longer sessions allow for more time to pass bills and to negotiate a new biennial state budget. On Monday, January 9, 2023, the state legislature will begin a long session.
