The City of Burien will hold a public hearing on Monday, September 17, 2018, for the purpose of:

Receiving public comments on the proposed allocation of 2019 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

The City of Burien's estimated 2019 Community Development Block Grant entitlement is \$468,871. The funding available after King County contract set-asides for the King County Housing Repair Program, Housing Stability Program, and administration is estimated at \$272,042. The proposed funds will be allocated to projects that are consistent with the objectives and policies of the current King County Consortium Consolidated Housing and Community Development Plan and federal regulations. The City of Burien is proposing allocating 2019 CDBG funds as follows:

- Planning/Administration: \$44,907 or the maximum amount allowable under the program to the City of Burien, CDBG Program Administrator, 400 SW 152nd Street, Suite 305, Burien, WA to administer the City of Burien's CDBG program activities.
- Human Services: \$44,907 is proposed for the New Futures Program, administered by Southwest Youth and Family Services. This program would serve approximately 200 low-moderate income Burien residents at the Alturas Apartments, 1101 SW 119th Street, Burien, WA, with family support and advocacy services.
- Capital: \$178,248 is available, with \$133,248 proposed for the Burien Community Center Restroom Renovation project for design and construction costs to add a third family-style furnished restroom. The Burien Community Center is located at 14700 6th Avenue SW, Burien, WA and this project would serve low-moderate income Burien residents. Also proposed is \$45,000 for microenterprise support program(s) to assist low-moderate income Burien residents seeking to start or expand their own small business.

The Contingency Plan if there are any increases or decreases to 2019 CDBG funding, is proposed as follows: Planning/Administration is the City of Burien to the maximum amount allowable, and then increases or decreases to funding to the Burien Community Center Restroom Renovation project.

The hearing will be in the Council Chambers at Burien City Hall, 400 SW 152nd Street, at approximately 7:00 p.m.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds

Proposed Use of 2019 Funds, project cancellation and reallocation of 2018 funds, and amendments to the 2016 and 2018 Action Plans.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Renton City Council has fixed the 1st day of October, 2018 at 7:00 pm as the date and time for a public hearing to be held in the Council Chambers of Renton City Hall, Seventh Floor, 1055 S. Grady Way, Renton, WA 98057, to provide an opportunity for public comment on the allocation of CDBG funds. Public comment is requested on the proposed 2019 CDBG allocations, and project cancellation and reallocation of 2018 funds, and amendments to the 2016 and 2018 Action Plans.

2019 Funds

The City will receive an estimated \$697,888 in 2019 CDBG funds. After contractual set asides covering the King County administration and human service program costs, the amount available is estimated to be \$404,775, which the City is proposing to allocate as follows:

- 1) **Planning and Administration:** \$69,789 or the maximum amount allowable to plan and administer the CDBG program at 1055 S. Grady Way, Renton, WA 98057; and
- 2) **Public Facilities and Improvements Program:** The estimated balance of \$334,986 is proposed for public facilities and improvements.

The Public Facilities and Improvements Program for Downtown/South Renton (the "Downtown Streetscape Improvements") will augment improvements already planned through the Downtown's one-way conversion at Wells, Williams and Main Avenues. Intersection improvements and sidewalk replacement are planned along S 3rd Street between Burnett and Main; Wells Avenue S between S 2nd and 5th streets; Williams Avenue S between S 3rd and 5th streets; and Main Avenue S between S 2nd and 3rd streets. The Downtown Streetscape Improvements can assist with improvements that will bring the public realm of the blocks in between the intersections up to current standards that include level and accessible sidewalk surfaces, better pedestrian-level lighting, additional trees and landscaping, and essential street furniture. More than 51% of the service area's residents are low and moderate income. The service area is primarily residential and includes Block Group 3, Census tract 253.01, and Block Groups 1-3, Census tract 253.02.

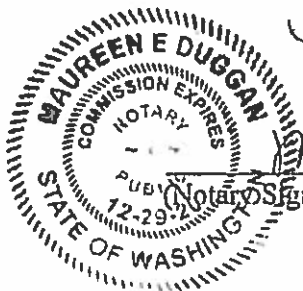
