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## Best Starts for Kids Youth and Family Homelessness Prevention Initiative RFP 1149-16 (VLN) Services Funding

Twenty-six grants in the amount of \$150,000.00 each were awarded to local non-profit agencies through the Youth and Family Homelessness Prevention Initiative RFP to provide client-centered case management and flexible funds to youth ages 12-24 and families with youth who are at imminent risk of homelessness. Under Council direction, the awards were directed to go to agencies serving individuals throughout King County where the highest rates of newly homeless are concentrated. In addition, funds were to be allocated in a manner that would increase the likelihood that a reduction of first-time homelessness would directly serve those disproportionately represented in the homeless systems.
