Project update

King County Solid Waste Division will study three site alternatives in the environmental review, as well as a no-action alternative.

- 11724 NE 60th St, Kirkland Houghton Transfer Station/Closed Landfill
- 7024 116th Ave NE, Kirkland Houghton Park & Ride
- 15801 Woodinville-Redmond Rd NE, Woodinville Property owned by Northwest Utilities and five other parcels with portable toilet rentals, manufacturing, automotive services, and vacant land


State Environmental Policy Act

- Enacted in 1971, SEPA is a law that requires state and local agencies to identify the potential environmental impacts of proposed actions and plans through a formal review process.
- When potentially significant adverse impacts are anticipated, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is required.

Scoping Phase: Overview

Scoping:

Opportunity for the public, Tribes, jurisdictions and technical experts to give feedback about what should be assessed in the project's environmental review.

Scope of study typically includes:

- Alternatives to be studied
- Elements of the environment to study
- Specific environmental issues of concern
- Potential mitigation (steps to minimize negative environmental impacts)



How to provide meaningful public comment

Comments that help shape the environmental review:

- Are specific and factual
- May suggest a different approach to meet the project need or a different approach to a specific part of the proposal
- Provide information or suggestions about a specific potential impact or potential mitigation

Comments that only express support for or opposition to the project or an alternative are not helpful for informing what the scope of the environmental review should be and are not considered.
