King County Solid Waste System




King County's Regional Solid Waste System Serving 1.4 million people

- King County regional service provider
- 37 cities all but Seattle & Milton
- 6 urban transfer stations
- 2 rural transfer stations
- 2 rural drop boxes
- 9 closed landfills
- 1 open landfill



System Overview



Role of transfer stations

- Receive & prepare waste and recycling materials for transport
- Provide local drop-off locations for consolidation and transfer of materials to regional facilities
- Provide more efficient transport of waste and recycling materials



Why is King County siting a new transfer station?

Existing Houghton Station is outdated

- Lacks adequate queuing space
- Lacks space for recycling services
- Lacks ability to compact waste
- Lacks space for waste storage in the event of a major regional disaster





Decreasing Number of Sites



Role of SAC in Siting Process

- **❖** Advise King County staff from a community perspective
- **❖** Identify community criteria for screening sites
- * Review potential sites and provide feedback
- Share information with their community and share feedback about concerns, impacts and aspirations
- Provide input on criteria weighting
- Provide King County staff with outreach advice such as reviewing materials and identifying additional groups to contact

Overview of Draft Charter

- Background: Need for a new NE transfer station, SAC convened with special emphasis on members who represent historically underserved and underrepresented communities
- Roles and responsibilities
 - SAC members: Advise King County staff from a community perspective
 - Facilitator: Ensure fair and open meetings
 - King County SWD staff: Provide information and listen carefully to SAC feedback
