

WHAT WE DO

The King County Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) serves

across a 420-square-mile service area:



We treat about

68

billion gallons of wastewater each year

while emphasizing sustainability and resource recovery:

Electricity produced: **19** million kw hrs/year

Reclaimed water produced: **700** million gallons/year

Biosolids produced: **240** million wet pounds/year

The agency employs nearly 700 people, including 200 employees in our **Project Planning and Delivery Section**, who are responsible for planning, designing, and building our facilities.

MEET THE UNITS

The Project Planning and Delivery Section is divided into five separate units. Employees in these sections typically manage about 200 active projects at any given time to upgrade, expand and improve our system and facilities.

The Planning and Modeling Unit provides systemwide planning, flow monitoring, system modeling and conveyance inspection services for the division.

The Engineering & Technical Resources Unit provides design and engineering services for capital projects and technical support to operations.

The Project Management Unit leads the design teams that upgrade and build new facilities, interfacing with our operations group that manages wastewater flow and treatment.



The Construction Management Unit leads the construction phase of projects, closely coordinating with contractors, operations and maintenance staff, design engineers, project control, permitting, right-of-way, and community relations staff.

The Project Control & Contract Management Unit provides a variety of scope, schedule, estimating, and cost monitoring and control activities supporting the capital delivery of wastewater projects.
