Construction to upgrade the 53rd Avenue Pump Station in West Seattle is ongoing. This underground facility located at Alki Avenue Southwest and 53rd Avenue Southwest is more than 50 years old and in need of repairs, new equipment and more underground space.

Pedestrian and bike path temporarily closed this week

In order to excavate to the full depth necessary for pump station construction, King County's contractor has brought in large machinery which must be set in the pedestrian and bike path adjacent to the construction site. During the week of September 22, pedestrians and cyclists will be shifted to the sidewalk on Alki Ave. SW. The temporary shift is necessary to provide a safe pathway for the public. Flaggers will be on site during work hours to assist pedestrians and cyclists.

Construction hours

King County's contractor, MKB Constructors, varies their work hours depending on the activity, but will work Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. or Monday through Thursday from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Stay Informed

King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. The project team will continue to work with community members to minimize disruptions to the daily lives of those living and working near the construction zone.
